ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning this day for His late Royal Highness The Prince Frederick Charles Nicholas of Prussia, Nephew of His Majesty The German Emperor, King of Prussia, and Father of Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Connaught and Strathearne, and a Relative of The Queen's ; viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Tuesday, the 23rd instant, viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Tuesday, the 30th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.
