WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial " of the dead in England beyond the limits of the "Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning "the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered;

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning "the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in so far as it affects burials in the churchyard of Boyton, in the county of Wilts, should be varied, and that the following directions should be substituted for those contained in the said Order with respect to burials in the church and churchyard of Boyton:—

That burials be discontinued entirely in the parish church of Boyton, in the county of Wilts, and in those parts of the churchyard that lie on the south, south-east, and east sides of the church; and also in the rest of the churchyard after the thirtieth September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, except as follows:—In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is t pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the thirty-first day of August next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said thirty-first day of August next.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial " of the dead in England beyond the limits of the "Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning " the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burials, shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, late one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that

burials should be discontinued therein, with certain modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by Her Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; and such Order has been published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the said

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as herein otherwise directed) as follows, viz. :-

GARBOLDISHAM.—Forthwith and wholly in the parish church of Garboldisham, in the county of Norfolk; and also in the old part of the churchyard, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework

or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of this Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water), burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

GARBOLDISHAM, ALL SAINTS CHURCHYARD.— Forthwith and entirely in All Saints Churchyard, in the parish of Garboldisham, except as follows:

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

CHUDLEIGH KNIGHTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Chudleigh Knighton, in the county of Devon; and also in the churchyard after the thirtieth April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly

cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of this Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Broughton, in the petry sessional division of Romsey, in the county of Hants, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Stone Farm on the east, by the road leading from Stone Farm to Broughton Firs on the north, thence in a straight line to Nine Mile Water on the northwest, thence in a straight line to the Farm in the occupation of Mr. Arnold on the Salisbury-road (leaving the Farm on the south and not including it) on the west, and thence in a straight line to Broughton Hill on the Mottisfont-road on the south, and thence back by the road leading to Stone Farm again on the east,—which was de-clared by Order of Council dated the second day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfive, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, held at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, on the 8th July, 1885, in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th June, 1871, the following verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz:—

brancer, viz:-WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, and which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfour, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain; and we took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether six sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and twenty half-sovereigns or ten shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule of the Coinage Act. 1870. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act was plus one thousandth of an ounce (oz. 001) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to Weight. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot. comparing it with the Standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to Fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found there was no variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue three sovereigns and three halfsovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123.280 grains, the second 123.294 grains, and the third 123.154 grains; and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 61.707 grains, the second 61.607 grains, and the third 61.577 grains. We then assayed the said three sovereigns and three halfsovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal Fineness of such sovereigns to be 916.5, 916.6, and 916.7 respectively, and the millesimal Fineness of such half-sovereigns to be 916.6, 916.9, and 916.6 respectively. We also took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether thirteen half-crowns, eleven florins, sixteen shillings, twelve sixpences, one fourpenny piece, seventeen threepenny pieces, one twopenny piece, and one penny piece, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy of the said First Schedule of the said Coinage Act, 1870. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act was minus thirteen thousandths of an ounce (oz. .013) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore,

they were within the prescribed remedy as to Weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the Standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to Fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was five-ten thousandths (.0005) and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to Fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one half-crown, one florin, one shilling, one sixpence, and one threepenny piece, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crown weighed 217.341 grains, that such florin weighed 174.745 grains, that such shilling weighed 87.342 grains, that such sixpence weighed 43.696 grains, and that such threepenny piece weighed 21.858 grains. We then assayed the said half-crown, the said florin, the said shilling, the said sixpence, and the said threepenny piece separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crown to be 925.3, of such florin to be 925.1, of such shilling to be 925.1, of such sixpence to be 925.3, and of such threepenny piece to be 925.3.
