boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane should be extended in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Stamford Hill, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green, and also all that portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington aforesaid which is also described in the schedule hereunder written and is likewise delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the said day of publication as aforesaid and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and also the said portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington aforesaid so to be included as aforesaid shall become annexed to and together be and form part of the new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane aforesaid.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Ann, Hanger-lane, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London

being:

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill in the said county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid which is bounded on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill from the district of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington in the county and diocese aforesaid at a point at the centre of the bridge which carries Amhurst Park-road over the high level line of the Great Eastern Railway, at the entrance to the Stamford Hill Railway Station, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the boundary near to the northern end of the said railway station which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill from the new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane aforesaid all which said hereinbefore described portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the east as aforesaid that is to say, upon the north upon the west and upon the south as follows:-upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane upon the west by the hereinafter described portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington in the county [

and diocese aforesaid and upon the south by the district of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington aforesaid.

"II. All that portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington aforesaid which is bounded on the south partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last-named parish from that portion of the parish of Hornsey which is comprised within the limits of Finsbury Park at a point on the western side of Green Lanes Bridge which carries the road called or known as Green-lanes over the New River and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said New River for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington from the district of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining part of the south and upon all other sides, that is to say:—upon the east upon the north and upon the west as follows upon the remaining part of the south by the district of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington aforesaid upon the east by the hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill aforesaid upon the north by the new parish of Saint Ann Hangerlane aforesaid and upon the west by the hereinbefore mentioned portion of the parish of Hornsey aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.
