WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the district chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrechfa Upper, in the county of Monmouth, and in the diocese of Llandaff, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and ten pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each

and every year: Provided always, that the said yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and ten pounds, expressed to be hereby granted to the Incumbent of the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrechfa Upper, and to his successors, shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of and in full substitution for the yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, heretofore payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, subject to certain conditions, to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the parish of Llanfrechfa, in the county and diocese aforesaid (out of which parish the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrechfa Upper, has been formed), towards the stipend of an Assistant-Curate for such parish, under the authority of another instrument sealed by us on the ninth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of the same month and year: And provided also, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and ten pounds, hereby granted as aforesaid, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrechfa Upper, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of a certain house and premises, which have been permanently secured to the benefice of Saint Paul, East Thorpe, Mirfield, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon, as a parsonage house for such benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Paul, East Thorpe, Mirfield, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
