And whereas one calendar month has expired since the said draft or copy of the instrument aforesaid was so transmitted to the respective patrons and Incumbents as aforesaid.

Now know ye, that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority for this purpose contained in the said Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do, with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he, the said Bishop, has signed and sealed this instrument), hereby order and direct that the boundaries of the said particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, shall, from and after the date of the next avoidance of the vicarage of the said parish of Warlingham, be altered so as to dis sever from such particular district all that part thereof, being a portion of the territory which was originally taken from the parish of Coulsdon as aforesaid, all which part is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan annexed to these presents and is thereon coloured pink, and that all the said part of the particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, so to be dissevered therefrom as aforesaid, shall as and from the lastly-mentioned date be reannexed to and again become, and be and form part of, the said parish of Coulsdon.

In witness whereof, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have hereunto affixed their common seal, and the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, has hereunto set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal this twenty-fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

The territory to be dissevered from the particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, and to be reannexed to the parish of Coulsdon, in the same county and diocese, being of that portion of the said particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, which was taken from the parish of Coulsdon aforesaid. All that part which is bounded on the south-east by an imaginary line, extending due north-east and south-west, and drawn through a boundary stone, inscribed "C. V., St. L. P. D., 1884," and placed on the north-eastern side of the Godstone-road, at the south-western end of the fence forming the north-western boundary of the house called or known as No. 1, Elm-cottages, the said imaginary line being twenty-one and a quarter chains, or thereabouts, in length as measured upon the map of the Ordnance Survey of the said county of Surrey, and terminating on the north-east upon the boundary on Riddlesdown, which divides the said particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, from the parish of Warlingham, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and terminating on the south-west upon the boundary in the middle of the line of the Caterham Branch

of the South Eastern Railway, which boundary divides the same particular district from the parish of Coulsdon aforesaid.

All which said hereinbefore described part of the particular district of Saint Luke, Caterham Valley, is bounded upon the remaining sides, other than upon the south-east as aforesaid, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the north-west, and generally upon the north by the parish of Coulsdon aforesaid, and upon the north-east by the parish of Warlingham aforesaid.
