THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honumrable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 and 1884, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order, bearing date the fifth day of February, ona thousand eight hundred and cighty-fonr, providing for the transhipment in the river Tyae of animals brought from the United States of America to the Port of Newenstle-upon-I'yne for conveyance to tle Foreign Animals What at Tyne Dock, in the Port of South Shields: Prorided that nothing hercin shall bo deemert to invalidate or make unlowful anything done under the said Order before this Order trikes effect. or interfere with the institurion or prosecution of any nroceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penaly incurred under, the said Orter hereby revoked before this Order takes rffect.

This Order shall trke eifert from and inmediately after the .thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty five.

## By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

TTHE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Swine-Fever (Infected Circles) Order of 1884 (in this Order referred to as the Circles Order), do direct and order, and it is hereby directed and ordered, as follows :

1. The Circles Order shall, from the dates mentioned in Article 2 of this Order, apply and extend to and be in force in the District men-
tioned in the Schedule to this Order, and shall continue to apply and extend to and be in force in that District until the Privy Council by further Special Order direct and order.
2.- (a.) The provisions of Article 5 (Power to Local Authority to make Regulations) of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from the date of this Order.
(b.) Except as aforesaid, the provisions of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from and immediately after the thirtieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

r Tule Lords and others of EIer Majesty's Most Henourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them rested under 'The Contagious Disuases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely), -the township of Widnes and the adjoining township. of Ditton, in the county of Lancaster,-which was declared by Order of Council dated the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfive, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
