Major-General Sir J. C. McNeill, K.C.B., K.C.M.G., V.C., and Colonel Ewart, C.B., Equerries in Waiting, attended upon Her Majesty on Horseback.

On arrival at the gate of Whippingham Church, The Queen and Her Royal Highness were received by His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, The Lord Steward, The Lord Chamberlain, and The Vice-Chamberlain.

At the gate, The Bride was joined by Her Royal Highness's Bridesmaids, and was conducted to the left of the Altar by The Lord Chamberlain and The Lord Steward, The Queen and His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales being on either side of the Bride, in the following order :—

Wagner's Bridal March was played as the Procession passed up.

The Service was performed by The Archbishop of Canterbury, with The Bishop of Winchester, The Very Reverend The Dean of Windsor, and The Reverend Canon Prothero.

The Bride was given away by The Queen.

Mr. Parratt, Organist of St. George's Chapel, Windsor, presided at the Organ, and the musical part of the Service was sung by the Choir of that Chapel.

At the conclusion of the Service an Anthem, "O give thanks to the Lord," by Mendelssohn, was sung by the Choir, after which The Archbishop delivered a short address; Mendelssohn's Wedding March was then played as The Bride, attended by Her Royal Highness's Bridesmaids, and The Bridegroom were conducted to the gate by The Lord Chamberlain and The Lord Steward, and returned to Osborne by the same route as on arrival :—
