(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 30th day of July, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered; as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

SCHEDULE.

An Area at Charlton, in the borough of Andover, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the first milestone on the road leading north towards the parish of Tangle, thence towards the west to a cottage belonging to R. Dowling situate on the Penton-road, thence in a south-westerly direction to a green drive leading from Charlton to the Weyhill turnpike-road, thence in an easterly direction to the Old Toll Gate leading from Charlton to Andover, thence in a northerly direction to the boundary of Andover parish leading to Enham, and thence in a westerly direction to the afore-mentioned first milestone on the road leading north from Charlton to the parish of Tangle.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the borough of Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries,

that is to say, the borough boundary from Wheeler-street to the Dudley-road on the north and west, Dudley-road and the Birmingham and Wolverhampton Canal on the south, and King Edward's-road, Edward-street, Newhall-hill, Frederick-street, Vyse-street, Well-street, and Wheeler-street, to the borough boundary on the east,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

THE Privy Council have licensed the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board to treat Offal in manner described in Article 16 (2) (ii) of The Foreign Animals Order of 1885 before being removed from the Foreign Animals Wharves in the Port of Liverpool situate at—

- (1.) Wallasey Landing-Stage, Birkenhead.
- (2.) Woodside Landing-Stage, Birkenhead.
- (3.) Huskisson Branch Dock, No. 2, Liverpool.

Such Licences to take effect from and after the 31st July, and to cease to operate from and after the 30th September, 1885.

Carlisle, Cumberland—at the Sands Auction Mart—on 29th July, 1885, and on every subsequent Wednesday during the continuance of the said Order.

Penrith, Cumberland—at the Sandgate Market—on 4th August, 1885, and on every subsequent Tuesday during the continuance of the said Order.

Cockermouth, Cumberland—at the Agricultural Hall—on 3rd August, 1885, and on every subsequent Monday during the continuance of the said Order.
