Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and of the said George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respecting signed and sealed this scheme, the said Bishop sealing the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said three benefices of Old Radford and Basford with Cinderhill and Saint Peter Nottingham and of and to each of them and of and to the churches thereof respectively shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty your heirs and successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever, of Parliament.

and that in exchange for the same, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said six benefices of Balderton and Clifton North, and Clayworth, and Farndon, and Skegby, and South Scarle with Girton, and Besthorpe, and of and to each of them and of and to the churches thereof respectively, now vested as aforesaid in the said George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell, shall thereupon and thenceforth be assigned and transferred from him the said Bishop and from his successors in the same bishopric and shall be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hardinge Stanley Baron Halsbury or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

A^T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of August, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the Worcester Petty Sessional Division, in the county of Worcester,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
