GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board:—

Mansfield Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Mansfield Union, in the counties of Nottingham and Derby;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 27th day of June, 1870, addressed (amongst others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Mansfield Union, the Poor Law Board made provision for the printing, circulating, and advertising by the said Guardians of the Parochial List and Statement of Account therein referred to, or any parts thereof;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision as regards the said Parochial List and Statement of Account should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE 1. When the said Guardians deem it expedient that in addition to the said Parochial List and Statement of Account, any such further information relating to the subject matters thereof shall be prepared as can be given within reasonable limits, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to prepare the same accordingly.

ARTICLE 2. The said Guardians may, in addition to the said Parochial List and Statement of Account, cause such further information as aforesaid to be printed and circulated among the Ratepayers of the said Union, or to be advertised in some newspaper or newspapers circulated within the said Union.

ARTICLE 3. The reasonable costs incurred under this Order by the said Guardians shall be charged to the Common Fund of the said Union.

*Re-exhibition of Malmö Island Light.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 227 (2) of 19th November, 1884, on the destruction of the light on Malmö Island:—

The Swedish Government has given notice, dated 29th July, 1885, that the lighthouse on Malmö Island approach to Örnköldsvik has been rebuilt in the former position, and the light again exhibited:—

The light is a fixed light, showing white between the bearings of N. 35° W., and N. 4° E., or in the fairway leading east of Rödfla; and red from N. 4° E., to N. 62° E. From positions in shore of the last bearing, a fainter white light will again be seen from the fairway.

On bearings westward of N. 35° W. the light is obscured by Malmö Klubb.

It is elevated 36 feet above the sea, and the white light to seaward should be visible in clear weather from a distance of seven miles, and the red light from a distance of four miles.

Position. lat. 63° 12' N., long. 18° 55' E.

This light will be exhibited annually from 1st August to 1st December.
