(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of September, 1885.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising so much of the parish of Little Wenlock, in the borough of Wenlock, as lies southward of a line drawn along the road leading from Buildwas by Bragger's Hill to the Nursery Ground, Little Wenlock, and thence by the Spread Eagles public-house along the road to Lloyds Brook Cottages, and thence down Lloyd brook to the parish boundary.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the borough of Stockton-upon-Tees,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
