COTICE is hereby given, that the Draft of a Scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises. duties, property, and liabilities of the existing Corporation of Woodstock, and for other purposes, has been received by the Lords of the Council, and the same is hereby published in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

Draft Scheme for the Borough of Woodstock.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Woodstock have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation :.

"And whereas the said petition for a charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said parish with the exception of a small piece of land containing about one acre situate in Blenheim Park with adjoining parts of the parish of Wootton, and the hamlet of Hensington, a municipal borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter :

"And whereas Woodstock is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter :

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorise the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act :

"And whereas the Mayor and Commonalty of the Borough of New Woodstock, are a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

"And whereas the Mayor and Commonalty of the Borough of New Woodstock are a body corporate, under and by virtue of certain royal or other charters :

"And whereas the area of the proposed borough is within the district of the Guardians of the Woodstock Union as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union, and whereas the said Guardians as such Rural Sanitary Authority are a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Sanitary Authority so far as the same relate to the said area should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner provided by this scheme :

"And whereas a Burial Board was in, or about the year 1860, constituted for the parish of Woodstock, under the name of the Woodstock Burial Board, and whereas the said Burial Board is a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in and attaching to the said Burial Board should be transferred to the New Corporation and the Rector of the parish of Woodstock for the time being in the manner provided by this scheme.

"And whereas part of the area of the proposed borough is within the District of the" Wootton Highway Board and whereas from and." after the commencement of this Scheme the New Corporation will as the Urban Authority execute the office of and be the Surveyor of Highways within the borough to the exclusion of the Wootton Highway Board.

"And whereas it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Highway Board so far as the same relate to the said part of the area of the proposed borough should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner herein provided.

"And whereas the said Highway Board is a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882

"And whereas certain land sewers culverts drains and other property situate in the parish of Woodstock belong to and are under the control of the vestry of the said parish: and it is expedient that all such property and any habilities attaching thereto should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner provided by this Scheme.

"And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for compensation to officers of the borough of New Woodstock, whose offices may cease to exist by reason of the grant of the new charter in manner provided by this Scheme:

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Woodstock Scheme, 1885.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The 'Mayor and Commonalty of the Borough of New Woodstock' are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.'

"4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Woodstock Union.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cense to exist, together with all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, jurisdiction, authority, and exemptions of the snid Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of Section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in a body to be designated the Trustees of Municipal Charities in the borough of Woodstock. of which the first members shall be Henry Pratt, Hotel Keeper, Henry Lock, Grocer, Richard Lay, Glove Manufacturer, John Clark Sheppard, Grocer, Edward Prescott, Draper, William Eccles, Printer, George Hewlett, Gentleman, John Banbury, Draper, William Robert Jardine, Grocer, all of Woodstock, jointly to be by them applied in the manner in which and for the purposes for which such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

"7. All market property possessed by or vested | shall vest in and attach to the said Mayor, Alderin the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attaching | men and Bürgesses of the 'said- borough' acting

to the Old Corporation in respect of the same shall vest in and attach to the Mayor. Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council.

"S. All property other than that in paragraphs 6 and 7 hereof referred to possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such shall vest in and be enjoyed by the New Corporation and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"9. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities and no further.

"10. Any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"11. All sewers, drains, culverts, pipes, or other sanitary works, if any, situate within the area of the borough created by the said charter being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Woodstock Union and used by them exclusively for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said area and all liabilities if any fattaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority in respect of the said area, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority to the extent to which the same relate solely to the said area, and if they relate to the said area as well as to the rest of the district of the said Rural Authority then such portion thereof as bears the same proportion to the whole of such liabilities as the rateable value of the property within the said area for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 bears to the whole rateable value of the property, within the said district for such purposes.

"12. All property possessed by or vested in the Woodstock Burial Board and all liabilities if any attaching to the said Burial Board shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor. Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough and the Rector of the parish of Woodstock for the time being acting as the Burial Board of the said borough in lieu of the said Burial Board.

"13. All property situate within the part of the area of the proposed borough within the district of the Wootton Highway Board and being the property of the said Wootton Highway Board and used by them solely for the purpose of the repair and maintonance of the highways situate within the said part of the area and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Highway Board so far as the same relate to the said part of the area shall vest in and attach to the said Mayor, Aldermen and Birgesses of the 'said- borough acting

by the Council as the Surveyors of Highways of the said borough in lieu of the said Highway Board and the said liabilities shall be a charge upon and shall be defrayed out of the rate out of which the cost of repair of highways within the said new borough is for the time being to be defrayed under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 and when such liabilities relate both to the said part of the area and the rest of the district of the said Highway Board and not solely to the said part of the area then such portion thereof as bears the same proportion to the whole of such liabilities as the rateable value of the property within the said part of the area for highway purposes bears to the whole rateable value of the property within the said district for such purposes.

"14. All land sewers culverts drains or other property situate in the said parish of Woodstock belonging to or under the control of the Vestry of the said parish and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said vestry in respect of the same shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in or be under the direction of and attach to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough.

"15. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"16. The term market property in this Scheme means and includes rights to market tolls and all franchises, liberties, privileges, and rights relating to markets and fairs, and all lands and premises used for the purpose of markets or fairs.

"17. Every officer of the Old Corporation who shall be in an office of profit at the time of the commencement of this Scheme whose office is abolished by reason of or who shall be removed from his office by reason of the grant of the New Charter or the operation of this Scheme and who does not obtain an office under the New Corporation which in the opinion of the Local Government Board is as remunerative as the one. which he has lost may apply to the Local Government Bourd; and that Board, if satisfied that under all the circumstances he ought to receive compensation may order that he shall receive such compensation as the Board may think just and no more; and such compensation shall be paid by the New Corporation out of the Borough Fund of the New Corporation. The decision of the Local Government Board shall be in every respect final and conclusive.

"18. For the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and this scheme, so far as the same relate to freemen, the Old Corporation shall be deemed to have been dissolved by the said Act; and all the rights and exemptions reserved by and the provisions of Section 10 of the said Act shall apply accordingly.

"Every person now claiming to be entitled as a freemen or burgess or otherwise, in accordance with the provisions of Section 10 sub-section 1 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, shall, on or before the expiration of one calendar month from the commencement of this Scheme, send to the Town Clerk his claim in writing, and future claims shall be similarly sent in on or before the 1st day of September in every year. The Town A 2

Clerk shall within one month after the expiration of the time for sending in claims make out a roll (to be called 'the Freemen's Roll') containing the names of all such claimants and the names of those previously admitted and then alive; and such rolls shall be revised and settled by the Mayor on such day or days as he shall from time to time appoint, provided that such day or days shall be fixed to be at least one month after, but within two months of the expiration of the time for sending in claims, and that public notice of every such appointment has been given by him by affixing notice thereof fourteen days previously on or near the outer door of the Townhall in the said borough.

"On every such revision the Mayor shall examine into the claims and all objections thereto, and shall retain on or add to the roll the names of those persons only who are entitled to be on , the roll, and shall sign the roll when complete.

" No person who shall once have established his claim shall (if alive) be struck off the roll on any subsequent revision unless notice in writing of any objection to his claim be served on him at least seven days previously to the date fixed for such revision.

"The Freemen's Roll shall be kept by the Town Clerk, and shall be open to inspection at his office by any person at all reasonable times on payment of a fee of one shilling, and he shall supply printed copies thereof to any applicants at the price of one shilling each.

"The property (if any) to which the freemen aforesaid are for the time being entitled shall be managed by the New Corporation, and the payments specified in or authorised by sub-section 1 (a) of section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883 (if any) shall be made by the Treasurer of the borough, who shall annually prepare an account showing in detail all such payments, and the surplus remaining after payment thereof, and the New Corporation shall deal with the surplus as by law required.

"The payments specified or referred to in subsection 1 (d) of section 10 of the Municipal. Corporations Act, 1883, shall be made to the Treasurer of the borough.

"The Town Clerk is authorised and required, when making out the first Roll of Freemen to insert the name of any freeman whom the books of the Corporation show to have taken up his free-dom, and who is known to be alive."
