THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Decree of the Italian Government:—

1885.—Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 20.

THE Minister of the Interior having learned officially that cholera has completely ceased at Gibraltar since the 29th of October last, decrees:—

(1.) Ships leaving Gibraltar from this date are exempt from quarantine, and must be received in pratique at all Italian ports after a clean passage and having clean bills of health.

(2.) Till further orders it is forbidden to import rags, old unwashed clothes for commerce, bedding (used), selvage, and lint.

(3.) The quarantine still in force for arrivals from Spain, Algeria, and Tunis must be purged, both by steam and sailing ships in ports having sanitary stations of the first class, where isolation can be observed, or at the Asinara for rigorous quarantine.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty do hereby give notice to such Lieutenants, Commanders, and Captains on the Retired List of the Royal Navy, as may wish to be recommended for the appointment of Naval Knight of Windsor, under the will of the late Samuel Travers, Esq.,
