2. All informations laid by or under the direction of the Parish School Board against persons for breach of the Bye-laws of the said Board between the 9th March, 1883, and the commencement of this Scheme, and all proceedings taken by or by the direction of the said School Board under the 11th and 12th sections respectively of the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

3. All resolutions passed and acts done by the Parish School Board and the Committees thereof between the 9th March, 1883, and the commencement of this Scheme if such resolutions and acts would have been valid if passed by a legally constituted School Board duly exercising its powers in a School District for which it had been elected.

1. All payments made by the Town Council of the borough of Croydon to the Parish School Board pursuant to the precepts set out in the first schedule and all precepts issued by the said Town Council to the Overseers of the parish of Croydon requiring them to provide the funds wherewith to make such payments.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 12th day of *December, 1885.*

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the borough of St. Helens,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
