**THE** Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

An area in the borough of Eastbourne comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Link's Stile within the said borough running in a westerly direction along the boundary of the Link's and Motcombe-lane to the foot of the Downs and continuing along the foot of the Downs in a northerly direction to Green-street Barn, from thence by the Occupation-road leading to Ocklynge-road, thence by Ocklynge-road and Upperton-road to Goff's-lane, and continuing in a direct line in a south-westerly direction to the Link's Stile aforesaid.

2.—(a.) The provisions of Article 5 (*Power to Local Authority to make Regulations*) of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from the date of this Order.

(b.) Except as aforesaid, the provisions of the Circles Order shall apply and extend to and be in force in such District from and immediately after the sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
