It is this day ordered by His Maj-sty in Council, That the late Embargo be, and it is hereby sujected and taken of from all Vissels trading along the Coasis of this Kingdom; and from all Sings with Provisions, bound for such Parts of Ireland as are under Obedience to Their Majestes, the respective Massers and Owners of such Vessels giving Security to the Officers of the Customs in the Ports, from whence they shall set sail, not to Trade under pretence of this Liberty into any Foreign Parts, or into any part of Ireland that is not now under Subjection to Their Majesties.
