

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and of the parish of West Hackney in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and of the said parish of West Hackney should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Stoke Newington Common as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London with the consent of the Reverend Arthur Brook, Clerk in Holy Orders rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Saint John at Hackney, and as such rector or incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and with the consent of William Amhurst Tyssen-Amherst of Didlington Hall in the county of Norfolk, Esquire, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament the patron of the rectory of the said parish of West Hackney (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and of the said parish of West Hackney which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Stoke Newington Common aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Stoke Newington Common.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Stoke Newington Common being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and of the parish of West Hackney both in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at a point at or near to the junction of High-street Stoke Newington with Cazenove-road where the boundary dividing the said parish of West Hackney from the new parish of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington in the county and diocese aforesaid joins the boundary which divides the said parish of West Hackney from the new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill aforesaid and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Cazenove-road aforesaid for a distance of forty-

six chains or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the same road with the road called or known as Upper Clapton upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill from the new parish of Saint Matthew Upper Clapton in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts thereby following the middle of the last-mentioned road to the junction of the same road with Northwold-road where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill from the new parish of Saint James Clapton in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts thereby following in part the middle of Northwold-road aforesaid to the point on the north-eastern side of Brooke-road where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Clapton from the parish of West Hackney aforesaid and extending thence southward along the last-described boundary for a distance of three chains or thereabouts thereby crossing Brooke-road aforesaid to the point at or near to its intersection by Evering-road where the said last-described boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of West Hackney from the new parish of Christ Church Clapton in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence westward along the last-described boundary for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts thereby again crossing Brooke-road aforesaid at or near to its intersection by Jenner-road to the point a little to the north of Brooke-road aforesaid where such boundary strikes the middle of the line of the Great Eastern Railway and extending thence that is from the said last-described boundary north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts thereby crossing Stoke Newington Common to a point on the northern side of the same common at the centre of the bridge which carries the road which leads from the church of Saint Michael and All Angels past the northern side of the said common and past the western end of Gibson's-buildings into High-street Stoke Newington aforesaid over the same line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said parish of West Hackney from the new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill aforesaid and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby following in part the last-described boundary) to a point at the junction of the said last-described road with High-street Stoke Newington aforesaid opposite to the gates forming the eastern entrance to Abney Park Cemetery upon the boundary which divides the said parish of West Hackney from the parish of Saint Mary Stoke Newington in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one chain or thereabouts thereby following the middle of High-street Stoke Newington aforesaid to the point opposite to the lodge on the northern side of the said entrance-gates to the cemetery aforesaid where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said parish of West Hackney from the new parish of Saint Andrew Stoke Newington aforesaid and continuing thence still northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of one chain or thereabouts thereby still following the middle of
