WE, taking into Our consideration that it is desirable that Wednesday, the twelfth day of May instant, should be observed as a Holiday in the City of Liverpool, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that Wednesday, the twelfth day of this instant May, be appointed a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Liverpool, and We appoint Wednesday aforesaid to be observed accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this sixth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year of Our reign.

When and so soon as an Inspector of the Privy Council shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to the said part of Shed No. 19 have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than the said part of Shed No. 19, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this Order, the said part of Shed No. 19 shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined.

THE Netherlands Government has published the following information—on the authority of the Commander of H.N.M. Surveying-vessel “Blommendal”—concerning Jason Rock, approach to Sunda Strait from the northward:—

Jason Rock, the position of which has now been determined by the officers of the “Blommendal,” had not been seen or reported since the year 1712, though frequently searched for. It is found to be a dangerous coral patch, about 50 yards in extent, with a least depth of 13 feet, and 16 to 19 fathoms close around, lying with the following bearings:—

North Watcher Lighthouse, N. 40° E.

Doea Islet, N. 89° E.

Pulo Peblakan (or West Island), S. 62° E.

Position, lat. 5° 24' 40" S., long. 106° 16' 00" E., or N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from that formerly assigned it.

NOTE.—The position of this rock is indicated only when there is a current; ripples over it were distinctly seen from the deck of the “Blommendal” at a distance of 7 cables; the sea was not seen to break on the rock, and the water was discoloured only in the immediate vicinity.
