**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 1st day of June, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SCHEDULE.

A Place comprising the grass field called East Glash of Leys, on the farm at Ardlaw, in the parish of Pitsligo, in the county of Aberdeen, in the occupation of the Representatives of Alexander F. Robertson.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, the following translation of a Proclamation issued by the Danish Government, in relation to quarantine:—

By virtue of section 32 of the Act of the 2nd July, 1882, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into Denmark, the importation of the following articles from Italian ports on the

Adriatic, between the Austrian frontier and the Cape St. Maria di Leuca, as well as from all ports in Sicily is forbidden.

Used linen, used clothes, and used bed clothes (provided the said articles do not belong to a person's private effects), rags, used wadding, wool, paper refuse, hair, and skins.

In pursuance of the above Act, quarantine has been ordered with respect to the following places: Italian ports on the Adriatic, between the Austrian frontier and Cape St. Maria di Leuca.

French ports between Nantes and Cherbourg. All Spanish ports and Gibraltar.

The provisions contained in clause II, section I, of the Act of the 2nd of July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into Denmark, are in force with respect to the following places:

All French Mediterranean ports; Italian Continental ports on the Gulf of Genoa and the Sea of Tuscany; all harbours in Sicily, Tunis; all harbours in Egypt; harbours on the Red Sea, Fez, Mequinez and Dar-el-Beida in Morocco; Rio de Janeiro, Havana; and all harbours in Japan.

Prohibition against the importation into Denmark of used linen, used wearing apparel, used bed clothes (provided the said articles do not belong to a person's private effects), rags, used wadding, wool, paper refuse, hair, and skins is in force for all French ports, Italian Continental ports on the Gulf of Genoa and the Sea of Tuscany, on the Adriatic Sea between the Austrian frontier and Cape St. Maria de Leuca, and all ports in Sicily as well as Spanish Mediterranean ports.

Prohibition against the importation into Denmark of used linen, used wearing apparel, used bed clothes (provided the said articles do not belong to a person's private effects), is in force with respect to Rio de Janeiro and Havana.

With respect to the foregoing it is specially commanded that linen, clothes, and bed clothes which are brought by travellers from one of the above two places shall be purified under official supervision.
