Bishop Rock Light-Alteration in Character.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 17 of 23rd January, 1886, on intended alteration in the character of Bishop Rock Light, and the exhi-

bition of a provisional light :-

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 25th May, 1886, that the character of the light has been altered, and from henceforth it will exhibit a double flashing minute white light, showing two successive flashes of about four seconds' duration each, divided by an eclipse of about four seconds, the second flash being followed by an elipse of 48 seconds. The light is elevated 115 feet above high water, which height will be gradually increased, as the work progresses, to 143 feet, the maximum height of the permanent light.
