THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, transmitting copies of a Proclamation issued by the Danish Government, of which the following is a translation:—

The Proclamation of the Ministry of Justice, dated the 27th August, 1885, respecting quarantine on ships coming from, or that have been in communication with ships coming from, Gibraltar is hereby revoked.

Meanwhile the provisions contained in clause 2, section I, of the Act of the 2nd July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into this country are in force as regards ships coming from, or that have been in communication with ships coming from, the said port.

Quarantine is in future ordered with respect to the following places:—

Italian ports on the Adriatic between the Austrian frontier and Cape St. Maria di Leuca.

French ports between Nantes and Cherbourg, and all Spanish ports.

The provisions contained in clause 2, section I, of the Act of the 2nd July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into this country are in force with respect to the following places:—

Gibraltar,

All French Mediterranean ports,

Italian Continental ports on the Gulf of Genoa and the Sea of Tuscany,

All ports in Sicily,

Tunis,

All ports in Egypt,

Ports on the Red Sea,

Fez, Mequinez, and Dar el Beida in Morocco,

Rio de Janeiro,

Havana, and

All ports in Japan.

Prohibition against the importation into this country of used linen, used wearing apparel, and used bed clothes, provided the said articles do not belong to a person's private effects, rags, used wadding, wool, paper refuse, hair and hides, is in force with respect to the following places:—

All French ports,

Italian continental ports on the Gulf of Genoa, the Sea of Tuscany, the Adriatic Sea, between the Austrian frontier and Cape St. Maria di Leuca,

And all ports of Sicily, as well as

Spanish Mediterranean ports.

Prohibition against the importation into this country of used linen, used wearing apparel, and used bed clothes, provided the said articles do not belong to a person's private effects, is in force with respect to Rio de Janeiro and Havana. It is further specially commanded that linen, wearing apparel, and bed clothes which are brought by travellers from one of the above-mentioned two places shall be purified under official supervision.

This Order shall take effect immediately.
