(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of July, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—in the parishes of North Stoneham, and South Stoneham, in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, on the north by the road leading from Red Lodge Pond passing through Old Bassett to the site of the late Swathling Turnpike Gate, thence on the east by the Portswood and Swathling-road to the Brook Inn at Portswood,
