The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty, of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation for altering the boundaries of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Hammersmith in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twentieth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and duly published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-third day of the same month a portion of the new parish of Saint Matthew Hammersmith in the county and diocese aforesaid and also a contiguous portion of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Hammersmith in the same county and diocese were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Simon situate in the Rockley-road in the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Hammersmith and the same was named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Simon Hammersmith.’

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Hammersmith should be altered so as to include within the limits of that cure all that further portion of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Hammersmith which is hereinafter mentioned and described.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop

of the said diocese of London as such Bishop with the consents of John Derby Allcroft of Lancaster-gate in the said county of Middlesex Esquire of Henry William Grace Child of Hurstwood Bexley in the county of Kent Esquire of Francis Augustus Bevan of Princes-gate in the said county of Middlesex Esquire of Charles Hobhouse Bousfield of Elvaston-place, South Kensington in the same county Esquire and of the Reverend William Handcock now vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Matthew Hammersmith the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Hammersmith, and with the consent of the Reverend Robert Handcock the incumbent of the same perpetual curacy and also with the consent of the Reverend John Hampden Snowden the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Paul Hammersmith in the county and diocese aforesaid and as such vicar or incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Hammersmith and with the consent of the Reverend William Allen Whitworth, the vicar or incumbent of the last-named vicarage (in testimony of which consents the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed (this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this representation the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon Hammersmith shall be altered so that they shall include all that additional portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Hammersmith which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the day of the same date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Hammersmith shall be severed from such new parish and shall thereupon be included in and shall become and be and form part of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Simon, Hammersmith.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with
