THE Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal granting the dignity of a Baronet of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland unto James Kitson, of Gledhow Hall, in the parish of Leeds, in the West Riding of the county of York, Esq., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten.

THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto James Cartmell, of Lincoln's-inn, Student-at-Law, and Bachelor of Arts of the University of Cambridge, son and heir of the late James Cartmell, Doctor in Divinity, Master of Christ's College, Cambridge, and Chaplain in Ordinary to Her Majesty, and of Frances Eliza, his wife, who was the only child of John Thomas Austen, Clerk, Rector of West Wickham, in the county of Kent, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may henceforth take and use the name of Austen in addition to and before that of Cartmell, and that he and they may bear the arms of Austen quarterly with their own family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
