RIVER THAMES ENTRANCE—WEST SWIN.

(1.) *Maplin Spit Buoy—Intended Alteration in Character.*

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on or about 1st December, 1886, the present Maplin Spit Buoy, western side of West Swin, will be replaced by a buoy lighted by gas:—

The light will be an occulting white light.

Further notice will be given when this alteration has been effected.

(2.) *Middle Cross Sand Light Vessel—Warning Signals.*

Also, dated 6th August, 1886, that in view of the risks of collision to which Middle Cross Sand Light-vessel is exposed, especially in thick weather, explosive warning signals will in future be fired therefrom at intervals of not more than half a minute, whenever there is reason to suppose that a vessel is approaching dangerously close to the light-vessel.

The signal consists of a charge of cotton powder, which will explode with a loud report similar to that of a gun, on attaining the height of about 300 feet.

Mariners are to observe that this signal is not to be regarded as an ordinary fog signal; it will only be used when the crew of the light-vessel have reason to suppose that a collision is imminent, and will be discontinued when the approaching vessel has passed clear.

(No. 210.)—INDIAN OCEAN.—CHAGOS ARCHIPELAGO.

*Diego Garcia—Shoal in Rambler Bay, Alterations in Buoyage.*

INFORMATION has been received from Captain A. W. Moore, H.M.S. "Bacchante," of the existence of a shoal in Rambler Bay, Diego Garcia:—

This shoal (Minni Minni Patch), having a depth of 17 feet at low water springs, is about half a cable in extent in a north-east and south-west direction, and lies with the following bearings and distance:—

Minni Minni (Magistrate's house) S. 48° E., distant 6½ cables.

East Point, S. 16° W.

A small can buoy, painted black, is moored in a depth of 5 fathoms on its western edge.

Also, that the following alterations in the buoyage have been made in Rambler Bay and the channel thence to the southward:—

(1.) A conical buoy, black and white stripes, lies in 3 fathoms with Elder Rock bearing N. by E. ½ E., distant ¾ cable.

(2.) A red can buoy is moored off the N.E. side of the 3-fathoms shoal, which is situated S. 43° W., 7 cables from Elder Rock. The beacon formerly marking this shoal has been removed.

(3.) A red can buoy, on the north-east side of a 1½-fathoms shoal, lies with East Point bearing S. 6° E., distant 1 mile and 8½ cables; west side of track recommended.

(4.) A red can buoy, on the east side of a 2½-fathoms shoal is moored with East Point bearing S. 4½° E., distant 1 mile and 5½ cables; west side of track recommended.

(5.) A red can buoy, on the south-east of a ¾-fathom shoal, lies with East Point bearing S. 13° E., distant 1 mile and 2½ cables; west side of track recommended.

(6.) A red can buoy, on the east side of ¾-fathom shoal, with East Point bearing S. 20° E., distant 1 mile; west side of track recommended.

(7.) A black can buoy, in 4½ fathoms, with East Point bearing S. 13° E., distant 9½ cables; east side of track recommended.

(8.) A black can buoy lies in 5 fathoms with East Point bearing S. 87° E., distant 2½ cables; east side of track recommended.
