(1.) Maplin Spit Buoy-Intended Alteration in Character.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on or about 1st December, 1886, the present Maplin Spit Buoy, western side of West Swin, will be replaced by a buoy lighted by gas:-

The light will be an occulting white light. Further notice will be given when this alteration has been effected.

(2.) Middle Cross Sand Light Vessel—

Warning Signals.

Also, dated 6th August, 1886, that in view of the risks of collision to which Middle Cross Sand Light-vessel is exposed, especially in think weather, explosive warning signals will in future be fired therefrom at intervals of not more than half a minute, whenever there is reason to suppose that a vessel is approaching dangerously close to the light-vessel.

The signal consists of a charge of cotton powder, which will explode with a loud report similar to that of a gun, on attaining the height of about

300 feet.

Mariners are to observe that this signal is not to be regarded as an ordinary fog signal; it will only be used when the crew of the light-vessel have reason to suppose that a collision is imminent, and will be discontinued when the approaching vessel has passed clear.

This shoal (Minni Minni Patch), having a depth of 17 feet at low water springs, is about half a cable in extent in a north-east and south-west direction, and lies with the following bearings and distance:
