THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Old Corporation of Malmesbury, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:-

Municipal Corporations Act, 1882. Malmesbury Scheme.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

- "And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the town of Malmesbury, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation:
- "And whereas the said petition for a charter was referred to the Committee of Council:
- "And whereas it was proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the said charter, and Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Council was pleased to approve the grant of a charter so doing:

"And whereas Malmesbury is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not coextensive with the area of the municipal borough created by the said charter:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable pur-

poses (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act :

And whereas the Alderman and Burgesses of the borough of Malmesbury in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, named, are a body corporate under or by virtue of certain Royal charters:

"And whereas the said Alderman and Burgesses are a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

"And whereas by virtue of the Act of the 38th George III, chap. 59, intituled 'An Act for paving the footways, and for cleansing, lighting, and regulating the streets, and other public passages and places within the borough of Malmes-bury, in the county of Wilts, and the avenues leading into the same, and for removing and preventing nuisances, annoyances and obstructions therein' certain Commissioners commonly called 'The Malmesbury Improvement Commissioners, were appointed for the purpose of putting that Act into execution, and such Commissioners were previous to the commencement of this scheme the Urban Sanitary Authority for those portions of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter which form the old borough of Malmesbury aforesaid:

"And whereas the portions of the municipal borough created by the said charter, not situate within the area of the district of the said Improvement Commissioners, formed part of the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Malmesbury Union (which portions of the district of the said Rural Sanitary Authority are hereinafter called 'the Area abstracted from the district

of the said Rural Sanitary Authority'):

"And whereas the said Malmesbury Improvement Commissioners and the said Rural Sanitary Authority are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Improvement Commissioners and the said Rural Sanitary Authority, so far as the same relate to the area of the proposed borough, should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner hereinafter provided:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that in the event of a charter not being granted to Malmesbury, the property of the Corporation thereof shall continue to be held, managed, and enjoyed as heretofore, in like manner as if a scheme of the Charity Commissioners in pursuance of that Act had provided for such holding, enjoyment, and management, and for that purpose that the said Corporation should continue undissolved in like manner as if it were constituted by the said scheme, and it is further enacted that the provisions of that Act, and of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, for saving the rights and interests of freemen, and of persons who might have become freemen, should extend to the rights and interests of persons who were, or if that Act had not passed, might have become Landholders, Assistant Burgesses, or Capital Burgesses in Malmesbury, and that for that purpose freemen of Malmesbury might continue to be elected Landholders, Assistant Burgesses, and Capital Burgesses.

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter con-

tained:

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:—

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Malmesbury Scheme, 1886.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever day is the later. This date is herein mentioned as 'the commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The aforesaid Alderman and Burgesses of the Borough of Malmesbury are herein referred to as 'the Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the

'New Corporation.'

"4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough, as the Sanitary Authority, and shall thenceforth no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Malmesbury Union, or of the said Malmesbury

Improvement Commissioners.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Old Corporation shall be known and designated by the name of 'the Warden and Freemen of Malmesbury,' and shall under that name continue to exist as heretofore, and to enjoy, possess, have and be subject to the same property, rights, privileges, powers, capacities, duties, liabilities, and obligations as heretofore, save such as are abolished by section 2 of 'The Municipal Corporations Act, 1883,' and from the date aforesaid the Old Corporation shall cease to bear the name of the Alderman and Burgesses of the borough of Malmesbury, and all Acts of Parliament, deeds, and documents referring to the Old Corporation shall be deemed to refer and be read as referring to the Warden and Freemen of Malmesbury.

"6. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the said Malmesbury Improvement Commissioners shall be and are hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth cease to exist, but nothing herein contained shall prevent or affect the operation of section 310 of the

Public Health Act, 1875.

"7. All sewers, drains, cesspools, culverts, west the London and North-Western Railway wells, pipes, pumps, mains, or other sanitary and the lane from the Railway to the New-road

works (if any) situate within the area abstracted from the district of the said Rural Sanitary Authority, and being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Malmesbury Union, and used by them solely for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said area, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority as such solely in respect of the said area and such proportion of the liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority as such as well in respect of the said area as the rest of its district, as is hereinafter mentioned, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough. The proportion aforesaid shall be such part of the said liabilities as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said liabilities as that part of the rateable value of the property within the said area (according to the valuation list in force immediately before the commencement of this scheme) in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the purposes of the Separate Rate for Special Expenses bears to that part of the rateable value of the property within the whole district of the said Rural Sanitary Authority (according to the same list) in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the same pur-

"8, The officer or member of the 'Old Corporation,' heretofore known as the 'Alderman,' shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme be called the 'Warden,' and all Acts of Parliament, deeds, and documents referring to the said alderman shall be deemed to refer and be construed as referring to the warden.

"9. Nothing contained in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect the title of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in right of the Crown to any land or hereditaments, or to any rights of whatsoever description; neither shall anything in this Scheme contained extend or take away, prejudice, diminish, or alter any of the estates, rights, privileges, powers, or authorities vested in or enjoyed or exercisable by the Queen's Majesty, Her heirs, or successors.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuropneumonia (namely),—in the Birmingham Division of the county of Warwick comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the New-road leading to Hodge Hill ending at the Common including the Steehford-lane from its junction with the turnpike-road near the Fox and Goose Inn down to Steehford Bridge on the river Cole, on the south the river Cole, on the west the London and North-Western Railway and the lane from the Railway to the New-road

aforesaid, and on the east the pasture lands of the Castle Bromwich farm,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
