THE COLONY OF BRITISH GUIANA.

WHEREAS the boundary line between Her Majesty's Colony of British Guiana and the Republic of Venezuela is in dispute between Her Majesty's Government and the Government of Venezuela:

And whereas it has come to the knowledge of Her Majesty's Government that grants of land within the territory claimed by Her Majesty's Government as part of the said Colony have been made, or purport to have been made, by or in the name of the Government of Venezuela.

Notice is hereby given, that no title to land, or to any right in, or over, or affecting any land within the territory claimed by Her Majesty's Government as forming part of the Colony of British Guiana, purporting to be derived from or through the Government of Venezuela or any officer or person authorized by that Government, will be admitted or recognized by Her Majesty or by the Government of British Guiana; and that any person taking possession of, or exercising any right over, any such land under colour of any such title, or pretended title, will be liable to be treated as a trespasser under the laws of the said Colony.

A map showing the boundary between British Guiana and Venezuela, claimed by Her Majesty's Government, can be seen in the Library of the Colonial Office, Downing-street, or at the Office of the Government Secretary, Georgetown, British Guiana.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, enclosing the following translation of Official Notices on the subject of quarantine in Austria-Hungary:—

ALL vessels arriving from the Island of Sardinia will be subjected to medical inspection, to disinfection, and to a seven days' period of

observation in the maritime lazzaretto of Martin-

Fiume, October 11, 1886.

All vessels arriving from Fiume in the other ports of the Hungaro-Croatian coast will, after strict medical examination, be admitted to free pratique.

Fiume, October 11, 1886.

Vessels arriving from Fiume and the other ports of the Hungaro-Croatian littoral without any suspicious cases, will, in future, be admitted to free pratique in all the ports of the Austro-Illyrian coast after medical inspection and disinfection of effects.

All vessels arriving from the Venetian coast in Austro-Illyrian ports without any suspicious cases, will, in future, only be subjected to a 24 hours' supervision, to medical examination, and to disinfection of effects.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, enclosing the following Translations of the Telegrams which have been addressed by the Bulgarian Supreme Medical Council to the Prefects of Trin and Widdin with regard to the precautionary measures decreed in order to preserve Bulgaria from the invasion of cholera from infected districts of Austria-Hungary :-

> Telegram from Medical Council to the Prefect of Trin.

"13th September, 1886.-No. 2213. "Travellers who come from Austria-Hungary

will be detained in an isolated place, where they will be immediately subjected to a medical visit by the doctor of the district of Trin. After an ordinary disinfection, in accordance with the regulations, travellers, together with their luggage and merchandise, will be at liberty to enter the interior of the country. Travellers arriving with symptoms of a derangement of the digestive organs will be detained five days, and, in cases where the malady makes progress, till complete recovery. Postal bags, merchandise, and other articles which come from infected towns of Austria-Hungary, will be subjected to disinfection in accordance with the quarantine regulations.

Telegram from the Medical Council to the Prefect of Widdin.

"18th September, 1886.—No. 2233.

"Upon a communication from the Roumanian Government, all travellers who arrive from Austria-Hungary will be subjected at the frontier to a medical visit and disinfection. A second medical visit at Widdin for travellers who come from the Danube is unnecessary. In the case of the appearance of cholera being formally ascertained in Roumania, quarantine measures will be taken all along the whole frontier. The necessary orders have been given for a sum of 1,500 francs to be put at your disposal for the construction of a special hut."

Vladivostock, the Governor-General of Odessa has imposed a quarantine on arrivals from these places of six days, to be reduced to three days on production of a satisfactory certificate by the ship's doctor.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Cholera Regulations .- (Rags from Austria-Hungary.):-

To all Port Sanitary Authorities ;-

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities ;-

To all Officers of Customs;

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid; --

To all Masters of Ships ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent in

certain parts of Austria-Hungary, and it is expedient that regulations should be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Authority or Authorities hereinafter specified:-

ARTICLE 1. In this Order-

The term "Sanitary Authority" means Port Sanitary Authority, Urban Sanitary Authority, or Rural Sanitary Authority;

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship.

ARTICLE 2. From and after the date of this Order, and until the first day of April, 1887, no rags from Austria-Hungary shall be delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, nor landed in any port or place in England or Wales.

ARTICLE 3. If any rags shall be delivered overside or landed in contravention of this Order, they shall, unless forthwith exported, be destroyed by the person having control over the same, with such precautions as may be directed by the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary Authority within whose jurisdiction or district the same may be found.

ARTICLE 4. All masters of vessels, consignees, and other persons having control of any rags prohibited under this Order from being delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, or landed, are required to obey these regulations.

ARTICLE 5. All Officers of Customs are empowered to prevent the delivery overside or landing of rags in contravention of this Order.

ARTICLE 6. It shall be the duty of the Sanitary Authority to take proceedings against masters of ships, consignees, or other persons having control over any rags, who shall wilfully neglect or refuse to obey or carry out, or shall obstruct the execution of any of these regulations.

NOTICE.—The Public Health Act, 1875, provides by Section 130 that any person wilfully neglecting, or refusing to obey or carry out, or obstructing the execution of any regulation made under that Section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds.
