THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by Order of Council dated the twentyfifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be a Place infected with pleuropneumonia (namely),—the byres and the whole of the grass fields, excepting the field of first years grass for hay No. 1, on the farm of Roquharrold, in the parish of Kemnay, in the county of Aberdeen, occupied by Mr. George Reid, together with the grass field called Rougharrold situate on the adjoining farm of Cairnton, in the occupation of Mr. Benjamin Emslie,-are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said Order of Council to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
