**W**HEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's Dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas in accordance with section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870," the Legislature of the Dominion of Canada has, by laws passed in the years 1877 and 1882, and respectively styled "The Extradition Act, 1877," and "An Act to Amend the Extradition Act, 1877," made provision for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or are suspected of being in the Dominion.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Guatemala, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

"HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and his Excellency the President of the Republic of Guatemala, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty (that is to say):

"Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, James Plaister Harriss-Gastrell, Esquire, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General to the Republic of Guatemala;

"And his Excellency the President of the Republic of Guatemala, his Excellency Señor Don Manuel J. Dardon, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Guatemala;

"Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good

"Quienes, despues de haberse comunicado mutuamente sus respectivos plenos poderes, y en-

and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles :—

“ARTICLE I.

“The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II, committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

“ARTICLE II.

“The extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences :—

“1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt to murder.

“2. Manslaughter.

“3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.

“4. Rape.

“5. Aggravated or indecent assault; carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of 10 years; carnal knowledge of a girl above the age of 10 years and under the age of 12 years; indecent assault upon any female, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 12 years of age.

“6. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child-stealing, abandoning, exposing, or unlawfully detaining children.

“7. Abduction of minors.

“8. Bigamy.

“9. Wounding, or inflicting grievous bodily harm.

“10. Assaulting a Magistrate, or peace or public officer.

“11. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.

“12. Perjury or subornation of perjury.

“13. Arson.

“14. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.

“15. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any Company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

“16. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

“17 (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

“(b.) Forgery, or counterfeiting or altering, or uttering what is forged, counterfeited, or altered.

“(c.) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin of the realm or national coin.

“18. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.

“19. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger persons in a railway train.

“20. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

“ARTICULO I.

“Las Altas Partes Contratantes se comprometen á entregarse recíprocamente en las condiciones y circunstancias expresadas en el presente Tratado, las personas que siendo acusadas ó convictas de los delitos ó crímenes enumerados en el Artículo II, cometidos en el territorio de una de las Partes, se encuentren dentro del territorio de la otra Parte.

“ARTICULO II.

“La extradición será recíprocamente acordada por los siguientes crímenes ó delitos :—

“14. Robo con efraccion, robo con violencia, rateria, y hurto.

“15. Fraude cometido por un depositario de bienes, banquero, mandatario, comisionista, administrador de bienes ajenos, tutor, curador, liquidador, síndico, oficial ministerial, director, miembro ú oficial público de alguna Compañia, considerado el fraude como criminal por alguna ley vigente.

“16. Estafa ó todo lo que sea obtener dinero, fianza ó mercaderias por medio de falsos datos; recibir dinero, fianza ó cualesquiera otros valores, sabiendo que han sido robados ó adquiridos en oposicion á las leyes.

“17. (a.) Falsificar ó alterar moneda, ó poner en circulacion moneda falsa ó alterada.

“(b.) Contrahacer, falsificar ó alterar, ó poner en circulacion lo que está falsificado, contrahecho ó alterado.

“(c.) Hacer premeditadamente, sin permiso de la autoridad constituida, algun instrumento, herramienta ó máquina con la intencion de falsificar ó contrahacer la moneda nacional.

“18. Crímenes cometidos contra la Ley de Quiebras.

“19. Cualquier acto doloso ejecutado con la mira de poner en peligro las personas que viajen en trenes de ferro carriles.

“20. Perjuicio malicioso causado á la propiedad, si el delito es justiciable.

“ 21. Crimes committed at sea.

“ (a.) Piracy, by the law of nations.

“ (b.) Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

“ (c.) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

“ (d.) Assault on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life, or to do grievous bodily harm.

“ 22. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute an offence against the laws of both countries.

“ The extradition is also to take place for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes as an accessory before or after the fact, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

“ ARTICLE III.

“ No Guatemalan shall be delivered up by the Government of Guatemala to the Government of the United Kingdom, and no subject of the United Kingdom shall be delivered up by the Government thereof to the Government of Guatemala.

“ ARTICLE IV.

“ The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Guatemala, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Guatemala or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

“ If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or on the part of the Government of Guatemala, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of Guatemala or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

“ ARTICLE V.

“ The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

“ ARTICLE VI.

“ A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

“ ARTICLE VII.

“ A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

“ ARTICLE VIII.

“ The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

“ The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant

“ ARTICULO IV.

“ La extradición no se efectuará si la persona reclamada por parte del Gobierno del Reino Unido, ó la persona reclamada por parte del Gobierno de Guatemala, ha sido ya juzgada, absuelta ó castigada, ó está aún procesándose en el territorio de Guatemala ó del Reino Unido respectivamente, por el delito por el cual se pide la extradición.

“ ARTICULO V.

“ La extradición no se efectuará si, subsecuentemente á la ejecución del crimen ó al empezar el proceso, ó á la convicción del reo, se puede oponer la prescripción para que sea exento de proceso ó del castigo, según las leyes del Estado al cual se reclama.

“ ARTICULO VI.

“ El reo fugitivo no será entregado si el delito por el cual se pide la extradición es de un carácter político, ó si se prueba que la petición para entregarlo se ha hecho en efecto con la mira de juzgarlo ó castigarlo por un delito de carácter político.

“ ARTICULO VII.

“ Una persona entregada no podrá, en ningun caso, ser mantenida en prisión ó procesada en el Estado al que se ha hecho la entrega, por ningun otro crimen ó delito, ó por ninguna otra causa que aquella por la cual se ha efectuado la extradición. Esta estipulación no se aplica á crímenes cometidos después de la extradición.

“ ARTICULO VIII.

“ Le petición de extradición se hará respectivamente por medio de los Agentes Diplomáticos de las Altas Partes Contratantes.

“ La demanda de extradición de una persona acusada debe ir acompañada de una orden de pri-

of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

"If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

"A requisition for extradition cannot be founded solely on sentences passed *in contumaciam*, but persons convicted for contumacy shall be deemed to be accused persons.

#### "ARTICLE IX.

"If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

"The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him, and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

#### "ARTICLE X.

"A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction: provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in Guatemala as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty.

"The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

#### "ARTICLE XI.

"The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

#### "ARTICLE XII.

"In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as entirely valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and

sentences issued therein, provided such documents purport to be signed or certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Officer of such State, and are authenticated by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of State.

“ARTICLE XIII.

“If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties, in pursuance of the present Treaty, should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date; unless any other arrangement should have been made between the different Governments to determine the preference, either on account of the gravity of the crime or offence, or for any other reason.

“ARTICLE XIV.

“If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within three months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, he shall be set at liberty.

“ARTICLE XV.

“All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend, not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

“ARTICLE XVI.

“The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered and his conveyance till placed on board ship; they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

“ARTICLE XVII.

“The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty.

“The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the Chief Consular Officer of the Republic of Guatemala in such Colony or possession.

“Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

“Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Guatemalan criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

“The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

“ARTICULO XIII.

## ARTICLE XVIII.

"The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties, but shall remain in force for six months after notice has been given for its termination.

"The Treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of Guatemala, shall be ratified, and the ratification shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

"In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

## PORT OF HULL.—TRANSHIPMENT.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in Part V of The Animals Order of 1886 animals brought from any foreign country to the port of Hull, and being animals the landing of which is not for the time being prohibited by any Order of Council, may be

transhipped in the River Humber or in any Dock in the port of Hull from [the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf at the Citadel Estate in the port of Hull, subject to the following conditions:

*First.* That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the animals are transhipped be specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying such animals.

*Second.* That the owner, agent, or charterer of the landing-vessel has received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

2. Those animals shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated.

5.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after each occasion of use be cleansed and disinfected as follows:

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which animals or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash: except that

(iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for passengers or crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

6. Animals so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, and the Dock Company at Kingston-upon-Hull, and the Hull, Barnsley and West Riding Junction Railway and Dock Company, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

8. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

1. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the junction of the Warrington and Northwich-road at Stockton Heath to Kinder's Smithy, from thence by Ashworth's-lane and occupation-road by Whitley reed to Had's Nook, by the Warrington and Arley-road to Barley Castle, Bradley Hall, Reddish Hall, by Hall-lane to Grapperhall village, and along the Chester and Altrincham-road to Stockton Heath aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

1st. THAT the port of Buenos Ayres be considered infected, dating from the 1st of the present month.

3rd. That vessels coming from an infected port be only received in the ports of the Empire after they shall have undergone strict quarantine at the lazaretto of Ilha Grande.

4th. That vessels, notwithstanding their coming from simply suspected ports, arriving with cases of cholera, or which may have had such during the voyage, or convey cargoes susceptible of transmitting contagion, shall be submitted to a like quarantine at the aforesaid lazaretto.

(No. 13.)—Quarantine Notice.

UNDER the powers vested in him by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that:

1. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus, except Larnaca, from the province of Malaga direct, which left on or after the 8th of October, 1886, without having performed quarantine at an intermediate port, shall be repelled.

2. All arrivals at Larnaca from the province of Malaga direct, which left on or after the 8th of October, 1886, shall undergo a quarantine of ten clear days.

3. Passengers' baggage and merchandize must be landed in quarantine, to undergo the disinfection considered necessary.

4. Mails arriving direct therefrom will be landed in quarantine, disinfected, and delivered to the postal authorities with the greatest possible despatch.

5. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus from Gibraltar direct shall be required to undergo a medical inspection before being admitted to pratique.

(1.) *Particulars of certain Shoals in the South-west part of Java Sea.*

THE Government of Batavia has published the following information, the result of a survey made in H.N.M. Surveying-vessels "Blommendal" and "Hydrograaf," containing the six undermentioned rocks and shoals lying in the south-west part of Java Sea:—

1. Arnemuiden Rock is above water, composed of coral and sand, fringed by a coral ledge, which extends  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cables from the eastern end and about half a cable from the western end, with depths of 10 to 15 fathoms close around; it lies with North Watcher bearing  $W. \frac{1}{2} S.$ , distant about 17 miles. Position, lat  $5^{\circ} 12' 55'' S.$ , long.  $106^{\circ} 44' 15'' E.$ , or about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles east of that heretofore assigned it.

2. Etna Bank, above water, and composed of coral and sand, lies with Arnemuiden Rock bearing N.W. by  $W. \frac{3}{4} W.$ , distant 11 miles. From the south-east end of this bank, a reef extends about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables, and from the other sides 55 to 160 yards; the depths around are 14 to 16 fathoms.

Position, lat.  $5^{\circ} 18' 00'' S.$ , long.  $106^{\circ} 51' 10'' E.$ , or about one mile S.W. of that heretofore assigned it.

3. Brouwers Shoal (eastward of Etna Bank) has been searched for unsuccessfully, as on the reported position regular depths of 14 to 17 fathoms were obtained, this shoal is considered not to exist, and has been removed from the Admiralty charts.

The inner light is a fixed white light, visible through a small arc on each side of the direction of the lights in line; it is elevated 45 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

This light, shown from a mast, with a shed painted white at its base, is situate on Rix Point, and bears S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. from the outer light, distant about one mile.

NOTE.—Vessels approaching Miminegash from the southward, should stand along the coast within the red sector of the outer light, and having passed through it, should bring the leading lights in line, which kept so, lead to the outer end of the North Breakwater.
