Privy Council Office, December 3, 1886.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Local Authorities of the Local Government District of Ilkeston, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 :--

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Act to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized;

"And whereas the inhabitant householders of the parish of Ilkeston (the area of which is coextensive with the area of the Local Government District of Ilkeston) have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation;

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said parish a municipal borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the Charter;

"And whereas, in pursuance of the provisions of 'The Public Health Act, 1875,' and of 'The Ilkeston Gas Order, 1878' (confirmed by 'The Local Government Board's (Gas) Provisional Orders Confirmation (Droitwich), &c., Act, 1878'), the Local Board have undertaken to supply and do supply gas within their district, and for that purpose have acquired and laid down lands, gasworks, mains, pipes, meters, and apparatus, and it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer, and vesting of the gas undertaking of the Local Board as by this Scheme mentioned;

"And whereas there is in existence a School Board for the parish of Ilkeston, and it is expedient to make such provisions with respect to the continuance of the present School Board, and such other provisions in relation thereto as are in this Scheme contained;

"And whereas the Local Board of the Local

Government District of Ilkeston (in this Scheme referred to as the Local Board) and the School Board for the parish of Ilkeston are Local Authorities within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885; "And whereas it is expedient, in order to

"And whereas it is expedient, in order to remove any doubts, to make the provisions hereinafter contained with reference to the continuance of the Local Board ;

"And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred to the consideration of the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department);

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a Scheme should be settled pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:—

" 1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Ilkeston Scheme, 1847.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as the 'commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to, shall be, and is hereby placed immediately, on, from, and after the commencement of this Scheme, within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said Municipal Borough, as the Sanitary authority thereof.

"4. The Local Board, its powers, duties, obligations, and privileges shall continue, and shall be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all its jurisdiction, powers, and authority whatsoever.

" 5. Notwithstanding the creation of the said Municipal Borough, the School Board for the parish of Ilkeston shall be, and continue to be the School Board for the Municipal Borough of Ilkeston, by the name of the School Board of the Borough of likeston, in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner. as if, at the time of the formation of the School Board for the said parish of likeston by the Education Department, the said borough of likeston had been created a Municipal Barough, and the School Board of the parish of likeston had been formed and created for the said borough, by the name of the School Board of the borough of likeston, and as if the Local Rate and the Rating Authority had been the Borough Fund or Rate, and the Council of the said borough, respectively, and everything in connection with the said Board and School District shall be done and had accordingly, and not otherwise.

"6. All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the School Board for the parish of Ilkeston immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the School Board for the Borough of Ilkeston, and all charges charged on the Poor Rate and School Fund of the said parish immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be charged upon the Borough Rate or Fund, and the School Fund of the School Board for the Borough of Ilkeston respectively, and not otherwise.

"7. Any Bye-laws under the provisions of the Acts relating to Public Elementary Education, in force at the date of this Scheme in the said School District, shall continue in force in the said borough.

"8. Any act or omission done or made by the Education Department, or the said School Board for the parish of Ilkeston, or the Council of the said borough, or any Justice since the date of the said Charter, shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if it might have been lawfully done or made if it might have been lawfully done or made by the said Department, School Board, Council, or Justice if no Charter had been granted, or the said School Board had been the School Board for the Borough of Ilkeston.

"9. All the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, and property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in the Local Board, under the Provisional Order aforesaid and the Act confirming the same as aforesaid, shall pass to and be exerciseable by, attached to and vest in, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

"10. The term 'property' in clause nine hereof means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action, and all records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and the whole gas undertaking of the Local Board, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

'The term 'Obligation' in the said clause includes contractual and statutory obligations incurred by reason of, in respect of, or with reference to the gas undertaking of the Local Board.

"11. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty. or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Local Board before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority thereof.

"12. The provisions of this Scheme shall be taken to be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of section 310 of 'The Public Health Act, 1875.'

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Local Anthorities of Brackley, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Locals of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

#### "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

#### "Borough of Brackley Scheme.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, IS82, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized :

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Brackley petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a charter was referred to the Committee of Council :

"And whereas it was proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the said charter, and Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Council, was pleased to approve the grant of a charter so doing :

"And whereas Brackley is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not coextensive with the area of the municipal borough created by the said charter :

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act. 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporation Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act:

"And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brackley in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, named are a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

"And whereas the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brackley are a body corporate under and by virtue of certain Royal or other charters:

"And whereas the area of the Municipal Borough created by the said charter is within the district of the Guardians of the Brackley Union as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union; and whereas the said Guardians as such Rural Sanitary Authority are a Local Authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Sanitary Authority so far as the same relate to the said area should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner provided by this scheme: "And whereas the area of the said municipal borough is within the District of the Brackley Highway Board ; and whereas from and after the commencement of this Scheme the New Corporation will, as the Urban Authority, execute the office of and be the Surveyor of Highways within the borough to the exclusion of the Brackley Highway Board :

"And whereas it is expedient that all property and liabilities vested in or attaching to the said Highway Board, so far as the same relate to the said area of the said municipal borough, should be transferred to the New Corporation in manner herein provided :

"And whereas the said Highway Board is a local authority within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 18×2.

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows :--

" I. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Brackley Scheme, 1887.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as "the commencement of this Scheme."

"3. The said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bracklev are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.'

<sup>44</sup> 4. The Municipal Borough created by the charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the urst meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Kural Sanitary Authority of the Brackley Union.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, jurisdiction, anthority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation or any of its members as such, shall vest in and be enjoyed by the New Corporation, and shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the Municipal Borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"7. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph

6 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"8. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf the Old Corporation before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 6 may extend to satisfy such fiabilities, and no further.

"S. The Brackley Sewage Farm. comprising 61 acres 1 rood and 26 perches, used or intended to be used for the disposal of the sewage of the said parish, and vested in the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Brackley Union, and the piece of land used for the waterworks for the said parish, and vested in the said Authority, and all other sewers, drains, ces pools, culverts, wells, pumps, pipes, or other sanitary works, if any situate within the area of the parish of Brackley, being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of Brackley Union, and used by them exclusively for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleausing of the said parish, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sauitary Authority as such solely in respect ot the said parish and such proportion of the liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority as such as well in respect of the said parish as the rest of the district of the said Authority as is hereinafter mentioned shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough, and the said liabilities shall be defrayed out of and shall be a charge upon the district fund and general district rate of the said borough, levied or leviable by the Sanitary Authority thereof under the Public Health Act, 1875. The proportion aforesaid shall be such part of the said liabilities as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said liabilities as that part of the rateable value of the property within the said parish (according to the valuation list in force immediately before the commencement of this Scheme), in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the purposes of a separata rate for special expenses bears to that part of the rateable value of the property within the whole district of the said Sanitary Authority (ac-ording to the same list), in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the same purposes.

"10. All property situate within the area of the Municipal Borough and being the property of the Brackley Highway Board, and used by them solely for the purpose of the repair and maintenance of the highways situate within the said area, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Highway Board so far as the same were incurred solely for the purposes of the said area shall vest in and attach to the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough in lieu of the said Highway Board and the said liabilities shall be a charge upon and shall be defrayed out of the fund and rate out of which the cost of repair of highways within the said new borough is for the time being to be defrayed under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and when such liabilities were incurred both for the purposes the said area and the rest of the district of the said Highway Board and not solely for the purposes of the said area then such portion thereof as bears the same proportion to the whole of such liabilities as the rateable value of the property within the said area for highway purposes beers at the com-mencement of this Scheme to the whole rateable value of the property within the said district for such purposes.

"11. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property su defined.

of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following copy of the latest Ordinance of Maritime Health published by the Italian Government :-

1886 .- Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 22.

THE Minister of the Intérior, in view of the Law of 20th March, 1865, &c., and of the certified cessation of the cholera epidemic in the city of Genoa, and in every other part of the Kingdom, decrees:

ART. 1. All the measures of quarantine in force in Sicily and the adjacent small islands, and at Asinara, effected by the Ordinances Nos. 7, 9, and 18 of 19th April, 13th May, and 24th September last, against ships coming from the rest of the Italian coasts, are annulled in the case of ships leaving any part of the Kingdom on the 2nd instant or after.

ART. 2. Until further instructions, the obligation imposed by orders still in force upon ships carrying passengers from one Italian port to another of having a doctor on board, in accordance with the measures provided in the Ordinance No. 7 of 19th April, respecting the cleanliness and healthiness of the vessel and those on board, and the disinfection of articles used by them, will be continued.

ART. 3. On the same day there will come into force in Sicily and the adjacent islands and at Asinara the sanitary measures ordered by the Decree of 21st August last, to regulate the trade in rags and unwashed old clothes destined for sale, in second-hand bedding, and in cloth or silk selvage, and the prohibition to import manures will cease at the same time.

The Byc-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to the tramways constructed and now being worked by the Birmingham Central Tramways Company Limited in the Alcester-road and in the Park-road, extending from the boundaries of the Balsall Heath Local Board District to and around the Village Green at Moseley, in the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the King's Norton Union, in the parish of King's Norton, in the county of Worcester.

1. For the purposes of these Byc-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any of the said tramways, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" respectively shall include any officer or servant having charge of a car or being in the employ of the Company. The term "Company" shall mean the Birmingham Central Tramways Company Limited. The term "Authority" shall mean the Rural Sanitary Authority of the King's Norton Union.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than six miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. No car using a transway shall follow another car using the same transway at a less distance from such o her car than fifty yards, except as may be found necessary for the purpose of working the traffic at any terminos, provided always that in such case not more than two cars shall stand at any one time between the north and south corners of the west side of the Yillage Green at Moseley.

4. It shall be lawful for the Authority, from time to time, in such streets and roads as they may think expedient, to appoint and vary junctions and stations and other places where the engines and carriages shall start from or stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, and where horses may be changed or engines replenished, and to make such reasonable regulations as they may think fit for fixing the time during which such engines and carriages shall be allowed to remain at any such place and for enforcing order at any such place.

No engine or carriage using the tramways shall stop except at such junctions, stations, starting, stopping, and other places as atoresaid, for the taking up and setting down of passengers, changing of horses, replenishing of engines or otherwise, unless where necessary to preserve the distance required by Bye-law No. 3.

a. Except at a passing-place or terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. No person shall in anyway wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways.

7. No car shall stop on the tramways at any spot adjoining the Village Green at Moscley for more than ten minutes at any one time.

8. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byc-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
