Sec. 1. A bill of health from the port whence sailed, viséd by the Brazilian Consul at the same port, or in his absence by a Consul of a nation in friendly relation with Brazil.

Sec. 2. A bill of health passed by the Brazilian Consul from any port touched at on the voyage.

Sec. 3. Bill of health from Brazilian ports in which they may have entered.

Non-compliance with the disposition of this Article will subject the master to a fine of two hundred mil reis.
