Zurick, June 4. The Diet of Baden ended yesterday, where things went generally to the satisfaction of the Ministers of the House of Austria. They have likewise inanimously resolved to write immediately a Letter to the French King, in behalf of the Duke of Savey, and to fend it in the name of all the Cantons.
