(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of January, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the county of Banff, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the Harbour of Port Gordon at the west, and continuing along the Port Gordon and Keith turnpike-road until it reaches the turnpike-road from Fochabers to Banff, thence eastward by that turnpike-road to Inchgower, thence northerly along the road from Inchgower to Buckie to the sea there, and also the farm of Cleanhill, occupied by John Munro, all in the parish of Rathwen.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) TRANSFER OF PARTS OF DISTRICTS ACT, 1884.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council approved on the 20th day of January, 1887, of an Agreement bearing date the 3rd day of January, 1887, made between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Bishops Castle of the one part, and the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the county of Salop of the other part, whereby the jurisdiction, for the purposes of The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, of the whole of the district of the borough of Bishops Castle was transferred to the district of the county of Salop.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department),

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, stating that arrivals from the Gulf of Genoa, between Savona and Chiavari, and the seaboard between the Gulf of Gaeta and Cape Santa Maria di Leuca and Sardinia will henceforth be subjected in Austrian ports to a quarantine observation of twenty-four hours, medical visit, and disinfection, provided nothing suspicious has happened during the passage. This also refers to vessels now undergoing quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rio de Janeiro, forwarding the following translation of an Order by the Brazilian Government relating to quarantine measures :—

Ministry of the Empire, Rio de Janeiro,
December 11, 1886.

HAVING regard to the necessity of employing all sanitary precautions tending to avoid the propagation in Brazilian ports of the epidemic of cholera morbus which has manifested itself in some localities of the Argentine Republic and Oriental Republic of Uruguay, the Imperial Government has resolved, in conformity with what you propose in your Despatch of yesterday's date :—

1st. That the term of rigorous quarantine to which passengers coming in vessels from those Republics to Brazil must be subjected to be fifteen whole days.

2nd. That the disinfection of cargoes brought by the said vessels last the period in the opinion of the Sanitary Authority deemed expedient.

3rd. That in the case of any vessel arriving with cases of cholera, or has had such during the
