All vessels from such ports to proceed to quarantine station for disinfection of articles of clothing, bedding, &c. Hull of vessels to be fumigated. Inspector in charge to give Board of Health certificate, to be filed and vessel gets pratique. Board of Health dispensed with charge of five cents. per ton for fumigation; charge only for labour and cost of materials for fumigation and disinfection.
