THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Fife, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a certain head of cattle reported to have died on or about the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, and to have been buried at Droverhall, in the parish of Dalgety, in the county of Fife, subject to the following conditions :

- 1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a post-mortem examination to be made of the carcase with a view to ascertain the cause of death of such animal, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
- 2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, post-mortem examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
