In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c.; of the Old Corporation of Cowbridge, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

"Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized.

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the parish of Cowbridge, in the county of Glamorgan, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation.

"And whereas the said petition for a charter was referred to the Committee of Council. And whereas it was proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, and Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Council was pleased to approve the grant of a charter so doing.

"And whereas Cowbridge is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough created by the charter.

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts, which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts, or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorize the establishment or continuance of any Court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by law applicable at the passing of that Act.

"And whereas by an Order dated the 10th day of March, 1873, and made under the provisions of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council on Education (in this scheme referred to as "the Education Department") formed a United School District, by uniting the parishes of Cowbridge, Llanblethian, Ystradowen, and Welsh Saint Donatts (such United School District being named the United District of Cowbridge), and have caused a School Board to be formed for the said district.

"And whereas it is expedient to make such provisions with respect to the continuance of the present School Board for the United District of Cowbridge, and such other provisions in relation to the said district as are in this scheme contained.

"And whereas the area of the said municipal borough is within the district of the Guardians of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union, as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union.

"And whereas the Bailiffs, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the town of Cowbridge, and also the

Guardians of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union acting as the Rural Sanitary Authority of the said Union and the School Board for the district of Cowbridge are local authorities within the meaning of Part XI. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

"And whereas the said Bailiffs, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the town of Cowbridge are a body corporate under and by virtue of certain Royal charters.

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just, that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the School Boards Act, 1845, containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows:

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Cowbridge Scheme, 1887.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the Charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament, or Order in Council, whichever is later. This date is herein mentioned as 'the commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. The Bailiffs, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the town of Cowbridge are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' The Corporation of the municipal borough created by the Charter above-mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.'

"4. The municipal borough created by the Charter above referred to shall be placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid, within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority, and shall no longer be within the jurisdiction, authority, or district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all franchises, rights, privileges, powers, jurisdiction, authority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be, which have no pecuniary value.

"6. All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit, or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in the following persons (to be designated 'The Trustees of Municipal Charities in the Borough of Cowbridge'), viz., the Reverend David Bowen, Bachelor of Arts, Rector of the parish of Cowbridge, Thomas Rees, of Cowbridge aforesaid, Solicitor, and Lewis Jenkins, of the same place, Wine and Spirit Merchant, jointly, to be by them applied in the manner in which, and for the purposes for which, such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

"7. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, and all liabilities attach-

ing to the Old Corporation in respect of the same, shall vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority.

"8. All property other than that in paragraphs 6 and 7 hereof referred to, possessed by, or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, shall vest in and be taken by the New Corporation, and (save as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"9. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation, so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 hereof may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"10. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy, in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture, due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation, before the commencement of this scheme, may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation, or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 8 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"11. All lands, reservoirs, sewers, drains, cess-pools, culverts, wells, engines, pumps, pipes, or other sanitary works, if any, situate within the area of the parish of Cowbridge, being the property of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Bridgend and Cowbridge Union, and used by them exclusively for the purpose of the drainage, water supply, or cleansing of the said parish, and all liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority as such solely in respect of the said parish and such proportion of the liabilities (if any) attaching to the said Rural Sanitary Authority as such as well in respect of the said parish as the rest of the district of the said Authority as is hereinafter mentioned, shall immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said municipal borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough, and the said liabilities shall be defrayed out of and shall be a charge upon the district fund and general district rate of the said borough, levied or leviable by the Sanitary Authority thereof under the Public Health Act, 1875. The proportion aforesaid shall be such part of the said liabilities as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said liabilities as that part of the rateable value of the property within the said parish (according to the valuation list in force immediately before the commencement of this scheme), in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the purposes of a separate rate for special expenses, bears to that part of the rateable value of the property within the whole district of the said Sanitary Authority (according to the same list), in respect of which persons are liable to assessment for the same purposes.

"12. Notwithstanding the creation of the said municipal borough, the United District of Cowbridge aforesaid shall be and continue a united school district, and the School Board for the said United District of Cowbridge shall be and continue to be the School Board for such district

by the name of 'The School Board for the United District of Cowbridge' in all respects, to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the United District of Cowbridge, and the School Board thereof, by the Education Department the said district had been formed by uniting the said borough and the said parishes of Llaubethian, Ystradowen, and Welsh Saint Donatts, and the said School Board had been formed and created for a united school district, formed as last aforesaid, by the name of the School Board for the United District of Cowbridge, and everything in connection with the said Board, district, borough, and parishes shall be done and had accordingly, and not otherwise.

"13. All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the School Board for the United District of Cowbridge before the commencement of this Scheme, shall be and continue attached to and vested in the School Board for the United District of Cowbridge, in all respects as if the said district had been formed as aforesaid, by uniting the said borough and parishes, and the School Board had been formed and created for a district so formed, and all charges charged on the Poor Rates and School Fund of the said united district before the commencement of this Scheme shall continue charged upon the Rates and the School Fund of the School Board for the United District of Cowbridge respectively, not otherwise than and just as if the said united district had originally been formed by uniting the said borough and parishes.

"14. Any Bye-laws made under the provisions of the Acts relating to Public Elementary Education, in force at the date of this Scheme in the said School District, shall continue in force in the said united district formed of the said borough and the said parishes.

"15. Any act or omission done or made by the Education Department, or the said School Board for the United District of Cowbridge, or the Council of the said borough, or any Justice since the date of the said Charter, shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if it might have been lawfully done or made by the said Department, School Board, Council, or Justice if no Charter had been granted, or the said School Board had been the School Board for the united district formed of the said borough and the said parishes.

"16. The term 'property' in this scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights, which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"17. The term market property in this scheme means and includes rights to market tolls and all franchise, liberties, privileges, and rights relating to markets and all lands and premises used for the purposes of markets.

"18. For the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and this scheme, so far as the same relate to freemen, the Old Corporation shall be deemed to have been dissolved by the said Act; and all the rights and exemptions reserved by, and the provisions of section 10 of the said Act shall apply accordingly.

"Every person now claiming to be entitled as a freeman or burgess or otherwise in accordance with the provisions of section 10, sub-section 1,

of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, shall on or before the expiration of one calendar month from the commencement of this scheme, send to the Town Clerk his claim in writing, and further claims shall be similarly sent in on or before the 1st day of September in every year. The Town Clerk shall within one month after the expiration of the time for sending in claims make out a roll (to be called 'The Freemen's Roll') containing the names of all such claimants and the names of those previously admitted and then alive; and such roll shall be revised and settled by the Mayor on such day or days as he shall from time to time appoint, provided that such day or days shall be fixed to be at least one month after, but within two months of the expiration of the time for sending in claims, and that public notice of every such appointment has been given by him by affixing notice thereof fourteen days previously on or near the outer door of the Townhall in the said borough.

"On every such revision the Mayor shall examine into the claims and all objections thereto, and shall retain on or add to the roll the names of those persons only who are entitled to be on the roll, and shall sign the roll when complete.

"The property (if any) to which the freemen aforesaid are for the time being entitled shall be managed by the New Corporation, and the payments specified in, or authorized by sub-section 1 (A) of section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and this scheme (if any) shall be made by the Treasurer of the borough, who shall annually prepare an account showing in detail all such payments and all receipts, and the surplus remaining after the said payments, and the New Corporation shall deal with the surplus as by law required.

"The payments specified or referred to in sub-section 1 (D) of section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and this scheme (if any) shall be made to the Treasurer of the borough.

"No person who shall have once have established his claim shall (if alive) be struck off the roll on any subsequent revision, unless notice in writing of any objection to his claim be served on him at least seven days previously to the date fixed for such revision.

"The Freemen's Roll shall be kept by the Town Clerk, and shall be open to inspection at his office by any person, at all reasonable times, on payment of a fee of one shilling, and he shall supply printed copies thereof to any applicants at the price of one shilling each.

"The Town Clerk is authorized and hereby required, when making out the first Roll of Freemen to insert the name of any freeman whom the books of the Corporation show to have taken up his freedom, and who is known to be alive."

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACTS, 1878 TO 1886.

At certain premises known as the Corporation Depot, and situate in the Eastcroft, in the borough of Nottingham.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Monte Video, stating that the absolute embargo on all communication whatsoever between the Uruguayan and Argentine ports established early in November last on account of supposed Asiatic cholera was taken off, and a quarantine of 21 days substituted four weeks ago; one of eight days having taken its place a week since; and the period of quarantine from the Argentine to the Uruguayan ports being at present fixed at three days; although that from the Uruguayan to the Argentine ports is of five days.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Separate Parishes hereinafter referred to;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain General Orders dated the 14th day of February, 1877, and the 29th day of October, 1881, and by certain other Orders, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed regulations relating to the Election of Guardians of the Poor in the Unions and Separate

No. 25679.

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Parishes hereinafter referred to, and, amongst other things, made provision with regard to the dates on which the several proceedings in the Election should take place;

And whereas it is expedient that certain other provision should be made on the subject as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—Notwithstanding anything contained in the General or other Orders above referred to, in the event of a contest at the annual or triennial election in the current year of Guardians of the Poor in any of the said Unions and Separate Parishes, the several hereunder-mentioned proceedings in the Election shall take place on the following days; that is to say,—

The voting papers shall be delivered to the voters on the 6th day of April, 1887.

The voting papers shall be collected on the 7th day of April, 1887.

Voting papers may be applied for, if there should be a default of delivery, on the 7th day of April 1887, or before noon on the 9th day of April, 1887.

Voting papers may be delivered to the Returning Officer, if there should be a default in the collection, before noon on the 9th day of April, 1887.

The casting up of the votes shall commence on the 9th day of April, 1887.

ARTICLE 2.—The Returning Officer shall make his Certificate with respect to the Election on the 12th day of April, 1887, or as soon after such date as may be practicable.

ARTICLE 3.—The Unions and Separate Parishes herein referred to are those of the Unions and Separate Parishes named in the Schedules to the above-cited General Order of the Twenty-ninth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in which an annual or triennial Election of Guardians will take place in the current year.

Suez Canal—New Provisional Regulations for Navigation at Night.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 231 of 11th December, 1885, on provisional regulations for the navigation of the Suez Canal at night:—

Information has been received through the Foreign Office, that the following new provisional regulations for the navigation of the Suez Canal at night have been published by the Suez Canal Company:—

ART. I. From 1st March, 1887, and until further regulations are made, steamers are allowed to go through the canal at night, on the same conditions as those established for the day navigation, subject to the following arrangements:—

ART. II. Steamers intending to proceed at night must give information at Port Saïd, or at Port Tewfik (Suez), through the Agents of the Company, that they are furnished with the following apparatus:—

1. Forward.—An electric projector light, with a range of 1,300 yards ahead. This projector must be placed as near as possible to the water line.

2. An electric light and shade, suspended above the upper deck, and capable of illuminating a circular area of about 220 yards in diameter.

The Agents of the Company will decide whether the apparatus fulfil the requirements of the regulations, so that ships provided with them may, without inconvenience, be authorized to navigate the canal at night.

ART. III. If a vessel navigating at night receives the order to stop and make fast, she should, directly this is effected, extinguish all her electric lights, keeping alight, exclusively, the night signals ordered for vessels secured to the bank, namely:—Forward and aft, a white light. Look-outs must also be placed. On the approach of tugs, steam launches, lighters, &c., or of a vessel authorized to pass them, they must indicate the side on which the passage is clear by showing on that side of the vessel two white lights.

ART. IV. When two or more vessels, furnished with an electric apparatus, proceed at night in the same direction, the vessel which may have to stop should hoist immediately a red light at the

mizen masthead, and give three short blasts of the steam-whistle in quick succession, which should be repeated several times at short intervals, until the vessel following has repeated the signal. These signals indicate that the vessel astern must immediately reduce speed for stopping, should it be necessary.

ART. V. The dredgers working at night will exhibit from the highest part of them a red light, when they are not secured on one side of the channel.

ART. VI. When a vessel navigating at night is at a distance of 3 miles from a dredger at work, she must signal her approach by firing three rockets in succession. This signal must be repeated until answered by the dredger. The dredger will answer "observed" by one rocket.

When the dredger is drawn on one side, the red light at the top is replaced by a white light, and two white lights are shown from her netting on the channel side.

The dredgers lighted by electricity extinguish all their electric lights as soon as they are drawn on one side.

ART. VII. The signals from the passing stations or "gares," to vessels navigating at night are as follows:—

1. Reduced Speed.—Three white lights placed vertically.

2. Make Fast at the "Gare."—Two white lights placed vertically.

3. Proceed.—One white light.

When these signals apply to vessels approaching from the northward, they are surmounted by a fixed red light, visible from a distance of 9 miles. But this red light is placed below the signal when it applies to vessels approaching from the southward.
