

reign chapter one hundred and six hereby reports to Your Majesty in Council.

"That there is in the county and diocese of York the parish of the vicarage of Sancton which comprises the township of North Cliffe the boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the parish of the vicarage of North Cave which adjoins the said township of North Cliffe.

"That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Sancton was four hundred and ninety-one, that of the said parish of North Cave was one thousand three hundred and sixty-five, and that of the said township of North Cliffe, one hundred and twenty-five.

"That the net annual value of the said vicarage of Sancton is three hundred and twenty-five pounds and that of the said vicarage of North Cave is two hundred and seventy-five pounds or thereabouts.

"That His Grace the Archbishop of York is patron of the said vicarage of Sancton and the Reverend Edward Kaye Holt is the present vicar of the said vicarage.

"That Edward John Stracey Clitherow a Colonel in Her Majesty's Army is the patron of the said vicarage of North Cave and the Reverend John Jarratt is the present vicar thereof.

"That the said patrons and incumbents are consenting parties to the separation and annexation hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session held in the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter one hundred and six the said township of North Cliffe may be advantageously separated from the parish of Sancton to which it at present belongs and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of North Cave.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the before-mentioned Act the Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alteration above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the consents in writing to the said scheme of the patrons and incumbents of the parishes to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it shall be thought expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

"As witness the hand of the said Archbishop this first day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

And whereas the scheme and consents, referred to in the report of the said Archbishop are as follows:—

"The SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Report.

"That the township of North Cliffe in the parish of Sancton and county and diocese of York shall be separated from the said parish of Sancton to which it at present belongs and be united to and form part of the parish of North Cave in the same county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the vicar of the parish of Sancton shall cease to have cure of souls within the said township of North Cliffe and the vicar of the parish of North Cave, shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of such township.

"That the inhabitants of the said township of North Cliffe, shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Sancton or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that parish but shall be liable as other inhabitants of the parish of North Cave for the repair of the parish church of North Cave and the chapel-of-ease of Saint John, South Cliffe within the limits of the said parish.

"That the inhabitants of the said township of North Cliffe shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the church at the said parish church of North Cave, and the said chapel-of-ease of Saint John, South Cliffe and otherwise in relation to the same church and chapel as other inhabitants of the said parish of North Cave.

"That the fees for all such offices and services performed for the inhabitants of the said township of North Cliffe as aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the benefice of North Cave.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the patronage or endowment of either of the said benefices to be affected by this scheme.

"CONSENTS.

"We William by Divine providence Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage and parish church of Sancton in the county and our diocese of York, in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend Edward Kaye Holt, Clerk, Bachelor of Arts, the present vicar of the said vicarage and we Edward John Stracey Clitherow of Hotham Hall in the county of York, Esquire, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage and parish church of North Cave in the same county and diocese in case the same were now vacant, and the Reverend John Jarratt, Clerk, Master of Arts, vicar of the said vicarage, do hereby respectively signify our assent to the foregoing report and scheme.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Pro-
