A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 30th day of March, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the junction of the Old London-road and the Hastings and Rye-road at the Police Station, Ore, up the east side of Old London-road to Coghurst Lodge, from thence by the Coghurst coach-road to the public footpath crossing such road, from thence by such footpath to the iron bridge over the South-Eastern Railway on to Pigeon Cove Cottage, thence by the footpath to Bachelors' Bump, from thence by the footpath towards North's Seat to the footpath leading to Ore, from thence by such last-mentioned footpath to the gateway leading into Middle-road, Ore, from thence in a straight line past the Black Mill, Ore, to the Hastings and Rye-road nearly opposite Ore Parish Cemetery, and from thence by the last-mentioned road to the Ore Police Station aforesaid, -which was declared by Order of Council dated the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuropneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
