TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING
ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,
The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two Room, a clear days before the Drawing card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her inten-tion to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them. It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Despatch, dated 22nd instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, respecting Quarantine Notices at present in force in Sweden:

By a Notice, dated the 19th instant, the Swedish Board of Trade declares Catania, in Sicily, and the "environs of the Argentine Confederation" free from cholera, and the following named places infected with it :- Ports in the Red Sea (except those situated in the Province of Hedjaz in Arabia), Beyrout and Damascus in Syria, the ports of British East India, Chalon and Saigon in Cochin China, Tonkin, the Island of Mindanao (one of the Philippine group), China and Japan, Wladiwostok (in East Siberia), Montevideo, Chili, and Australia.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following copy of a Notice from Her Majesty's Government of Malta, relating to quarantine :-

#### Government Notice.

The Officer Administering the Government, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to give the following directions: -

1. Passengers arriving from any port in the Mediterranean, or Constantinople, as well as those embarking at Alexandria, Suez, and Port Said, will not be permitted to land at Malta, unless provided with British Consular certificates stating that they have not resided or been in Sicily during

the ten days immediately preceding the date of their embarkation.

2. Vessels arriving from Sicily, or which have been in a Sicilian port within ten days, will, prowided all are well on board and they bring no passengers from Sicily, be allowed to discharge and take cargo in quarantine.

3. Vessels which have left Sicily more than ten days before arrival in Malta will, provided all are well on board and they bring no passengers

from Sicily, be admitted in free pratique.

4. Vessels arriving from Sicily, and admitted to discharge or load under Section 2 of this Notice, will, at the expiration of ten days from the date of leaving Sicily, be admitted to pratique, subject however to medical inspection and thorough disinfection.

5. Susceptible goods from Sicily will not be allowed to be landed.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order as to Instruction of Children:

Freebridge Lynn Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Freebridge Lynn Union, in the county of Norfolk;-

And to all others whom it may concern.
WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed, among others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Freebridge Lynn Union, prescribed Regulations in regard to the government of the Workhouse or Workhouses of that Union, and by Article 114 of that Order provision was made for the instruction of the boys and girls who might be inmates of any such Workhouse:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Article 114 should be rescinded as regards the said Freebridge Lynn Union, and other provisions

substituted in lieu thereof:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby rescind Article 114 of the above-cited General Order so far as regards the said Freebridge Lynn Union, and We Order that the following provisions shall be substituted in lieu thereof:

ART. 114.—The children who have attained the age of five years shall be instructed during at least eighteen hours in every week in reading, writing, and arithmetic, and the principles of the Christian religion, and such other instruction shall be imparted to them as may fit them for service and train them to habits of usefulness, industry, and virtue.

Provided, as follows:-

1. If the Guardians shall so direct, any child above the age of thirteen years who is in good health, and has been duly certified to

have reached the Fourth Standard of the Code of 1876, or any higher Standard may be employed upon works of industry for not more than seven hours in each week day. Any such child shall, however, be required to attend School for intellectual instruction during three half-days in each week, with a view of ensuring that the proficiency which the child has reached is maintained; except that if the Guardians shall so direct, any such child who has been out to service and has returned to the Workhouse may be employed wholly upon works of industry, without being required to attend the classes for intellectual instruction.

2. Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to relieve the Guardians or any child from any duty or liability imposed by the Elementary Education Acts, or by any Bye-laws made under those Acts and in force in the School District in which the Workhouse is situate.

6. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or engine, or wilfully interfere with the

comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings of any carriage, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage or engine or break, or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage or engine.
