WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the district chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, which has recently been formed out of the parish of Newburn, in the county of Northumberland, and in the diocese of Newcastle, and to his successors, Incumbents of the said benefice of the Holy Saviour, Sugley, one yearly sum or stipend of two hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend
