

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Wick, in the county of Worcester, and in the diocese of Worcester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, together with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us, under and by virtue of a certain deed of indenture, dated the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made between Henry Hudson, of Wick aforesaid, Esquire, of the first part; Charles Smith Hudson, of Wick aforesaid, Gentleman, of the second part; and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part; which said deed is intended to be deposited in the Registry of the said diocese of Worcester, together with this instrument, after the publication of the latter in the London Gazette: To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, together with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, for and in respect of the period intervening between the aforesaid twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies has, pursuant to 38 and 39 Vic., c. 60, s. 12, by writing under his hand, dated the 27th day of April, 1887, cancelled the Registry of the Court Rose of Sharon, 68, Ancient Order of Foresters' Friendly Society, Register No. 3575, held at the Royal Hotel, Market-place, Dewsbury, in the county of York, on the ground that the Society has wilfully, and after notice from a Registrar, violated the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, in respect of the valuation of its assets and liabilities. The Society (subject to the right of appeal given by the said Act) ceases to enjoy the privileges of a registered Society, but without
