A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of May, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this hehalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the steading of Foulden New Mains, in the parish of Foulden, in the county of Berwick, in the occupation of Gilbert Millican, together with the field between the steading and the public-road,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be a Place infected with pleuropneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
