(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of June, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising all the lands and premises in the parish of St. Thomas, in the city of Oxford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Great Western Railway, including such Railway, on the north by the Botley-road and Park End-street, including such roads, and on the east and south by the easternmost stream running from Pacey's Bridge to where it joins the river.
