THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant in the Museum of Science and Art, Edinburgh.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 24, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Competitive Examination.

II. The Examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.)

* * No Candidate who fails to show satisfactory proficiency in any of the subjects specified above will be admitted to the competitive part of the Examination.

PART II.—COMPETITIVE.

4. Mathematics.
5. Mechanical Engineering.

6. Mechanical Drawing.

7. Physics—limited to properties of Matter, Light, Heat, and Electricity.

III. A fee will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination, according to the scale laid down under the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1879, by notice in the London Gazette of 29th April, 1881.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in Edinburgh, under the above Regulations, commencing on 23rd August, 1887.

A Preliminary Examination will be held in Edinburgh on the 9th August, 1887.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 29th July, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a proscribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
