

same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, together with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us, under and by virtue of a certain deed of conveyance, dated the first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made between Daniel Robert Fearon, of Whitehall, in the city of Westminster, Esquire, the Official Trustee of Charity Lands for the time being of the first part; the trustees of the charity known as Dormer Parkhursts Almshouses, in the parish of Greatham, in the said county of Durham, of the second part; and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the third part; which said deed is intended to be deposited in the Registry of the said diocese of Durham, together with this instrument, after the publication of the latter in the London Gazette: To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Stockton-upon-Tees aforesaid, and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the same vicarage shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, for and in respect of the period intervening between the said first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.

*Schedule.*

All that piece or parcel of land, containing one acre or thereabouts (being part of a pasture containing three acres two roods and five perches or thereabouts, situate in the new parish of Saint Paul, Stockton-upon-Tees, within the ancient limits of the parish of Stockton-upon-Tees, in the county of Durham), all which said piece or parcel of land is bounded on the north-east by Bishopton-road, on the south-east and south by other parts of the said pasture, and on the west and north-west by land belonging to the trustees of the charity known as Dormer Parkhursts Almshouses, and is more particularly delineated on the plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Andrew, Willesden, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of ninety-five pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the ninth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage of Saint Andrew, Willesden, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house

of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Andrew, Willesden: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of ninety-five pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of certain benefactions, consisting (first), of a sum of six hundred and twenty-five pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the benefice and vicarage (hereinafter called the vicarage) of Verwood and West Moors, in the county of Dorset, and in the diocese of Salisbury, and (secondly), of a sum of six hundred and fifty-seven pounds four pounds per centum perpetual debenture stock of the Metropolitan Railway Company, which has been transferred into our name for the benefit of the said vicarage of Verwood and West Moors, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Verwood and West Moors, and to his successors, to meet the aforesaid benefactions, one yearly sum or stipend of forty-five pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
