WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the twelfth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Luke, Brierfield, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the third day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the *London Gazette* on the following day, a part of the parochial chapelry of Little Marsden (within the original limits of the parish of Whalley) in the county and diocese aforesaid was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke situate at Brierfield within the limits of the said parochial chapelry, and the same was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Luke Brierfield.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Luke Brierfield has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Luke Brierfield should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly repre-

sent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Luke Brierfield shall be altered by way of extension so as to include therein all that extra-parochial territory which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the same day, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said extra-parochial territory so to be included as aforesaid shall become and be a form part of the said new parish of Saint Luke Brierfield.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Luke Brierfield in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester being:—

"All that portion of the extra-parochial territory called or known as Reedley Hallows, Filly Close, and New Laund Booth, in the said county and diocese, which is not comprised within the limits of the new parish of Saint Aine Fence in the same county and diocese which said portion of such extra-parochial territory is situate to the south-east and east of the river called or known as Pendle Water."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the cure affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.
