THE following further Addresses and Resolutions of Congratulation on the occasion of Her Majesty having attained the Fiftieth Year of Her Reign, which have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been laid before Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, Merchants, Bankers, Shipowners, and Traders of the City of London, composing the London Chamber of Commerce (Incorporated); most respectfully desire to approach the Throne on the auspicious occasion of Your Majesty having completed the Fiftieth Year of Your Reign over the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Colonies, and Possessions, to assure Your Majesty of our fervent and unabated attachment to Your Majesty's Throne and Royal Person.
