WE, the Members of the Ballymena Archæological Society, humbly avail ourselves of the opportunity presented by Your Majesty's Jubilee, to approach Your Majesty with dutiful congratulations and devout wishes for Your future happiness.

We venture, in commemoration of the occasion, to beg Your Majesty's gracious acceptance of the accompanying gift, which, though of small intrinsic value, is yet of historical and local interest. It is an original specimen of the early Irish arrow-heads of flint, which are frequently discovered in our neighbourhood, and is mounted in Irish gold in imitation of an arrow-head with a portion of the shaft attached, recently found in a bog near Ballymena.
