We own, with profoundest gratitude, His past mercies, and earnestly entreat at His all-powerful hand a continuance of them by the prolongation of Your Majesty's life; and when it shall please the Omnipotent Ruler of the world to call Your Majesty, full of days, from a temporal to an eternal crown, may Your illustrious line, following Your bright example, reign over us in constant succession till the extinction of time.
